Just What Is United Fund In Klamath?

In answer to the many questions posed as to just what the United Fund is and does the residents of the Klamath Basin are invited to learn the facts about their local organization.

The United Fund here is the community's way of doing a vital job once instead of 27 times. It raises, budgets and distributes funds needed by 27 agencies serving this county's health, welfare and character building needs. You give through the United Fund to make these services possible.

Why try to accomplish these purposes through United Fund? Your United Fund was created by an overwhelming demand for a single annual drive instead of many separated campaigns during the year. It not only provides more money at far less cost of time (and money) to the volunteers and donors alike, it assures that your dollars are used wisely and effectively.

Following is a list of the participating agencies and the amounts allocated for the coming year by the budget committee of the Klamath County United Fund Board of Directors.

American Red Cross \$30,978; total man diseases research \$5,411; allergic diseases \$200; arthritis and rheumatism \$1,040; Boy Scouts of America \$16,148; Camp Fire Girls \$13,276; Girl Scouts of America \$11,674; YMCA \$17,322; University of Oregon YMCA \$150; Salvation Army, including White Shield House, \$13,796; Social Hygiene Association \$110; University of Oregon YWCA \$130; Oregon State College YM-YWCA \$140; Youth and Government, YMCA, \$30; Christie School \$630; Oregon Prison Association \$420; USO \$2,400; Volunteers of America \$350; Albertina Kerr Homes \$3,040; Boys and Girls Aid Society \$3,800; Catholic Service for Children \$920; Children's Farm Home \$1,430; Providence Nursery \$1,130; St. Mary's Home For Boys \$660; St. Rose Industrial School \$1,150; Waverly Baby Home \$830; Community Council Reserve \$1,000.

The theme of this year's United Fund is "give happiness," emphasizing the fact of giving more once, not once more. Your United Fund avoids duplication of services and solicitation, minimizes costs and allows for the most efficient use of funds. Listed below is a breakdown percentage-wise of what actually happens to the money contributed and where it goes: American Red Cross 20 per cent; youth agencies, character building and training 39.2 per cent; campaign expenses 6.5 per cent; disease research, heart, cancer, arthritis, etc. 4.4 per cent; pledge loss reserve 3 per cent; Klamath County needy children 9.3 per cent; year-round administration 4.4 per cent; rehabilitation, USO and other services 11.8 per cent.

It should be pointed out that these figures represent the true amounts being dispersed in Klamath County and Oregon.

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Oregon Firm Sale Told

An interesting Oregon enterprise was sold the other day.

William Dorsey, former general manager for DuBois Lumber at Vancouver and Charles Wilson, an automobile dealer at Corvallis, have purchased Western Pulp Products for approximately \$230,000, it is reported.

Ralph Chapman, Corvallis inventor, was co-seller with Fred Krehbiel.

The plant, established five years ago, was a type of re-manufacturing. Old newspapers and waxed paper containers were transformed into disposable containers for nurserymen and florists.

The operation involves two mechanical lines. One shreds and pulls old newspapers and molds pulp slurry under pressure into low-cost containers in which growers market bedding plants.

The products are distributed in the 11 Western states.

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
