Supply Ships Fight North In Big Race

FROBISHER BAY, BAFFIN ISLAND, Canada (UPI) — An Arctic task force is fighting time, tides and ice in a grinding battle with the elements that marks the annual sea lift of supplies for America's first line of defense in the Warning (DEW) Line.

The task force of the Military Sea Transportation Service commanded by Rear Adm. Donald T. Eller, Petersburg, Va., hasn't much time to complete its job. Before next month, the brief Arctic summer will be over and the water passages now open will close again, locked tight by ice.

Adm. Eller, MSTC commander, in the Atlantic area, has units of the Atlantic Fleet, special purpose cargo vessels, ice breakers, tankers, commercially operated merchant ships and reconnaissance planes in his force.

The DEW Line is a string of radar stations stretching more than 3,000 miles from northwest Alaska to the east coast of this island. Manned by Americans and Canadians, the line is designed to flash instant warning to North America if a surprise air attack is launched across the polar regions.

The MSTC fleet is heading for the eastern section of the DEW Line with some 20,000 supply items in the holds of its cargo carriers. On board are trucks, landing vehicles and big "Cats" (Caterpillar tractors) to move items inland from the landing sites. The cargo manifest includes sewing needles, paper napkins, toothbrushes, food, oil—everything needed to keep the DEW Line running.

The Canadian Department of Transportation has two ice breakers taking part in the sea lift and the 408th Photo Reconnaissance Squadron, Royal Canadian Air Force Transport Command, flies ice scouting missions across Canadian sections of the line.

Bruin Flat Work Ends

Ellingson Lumber Company of Klamath Falls has recently completed logging on the Bruin Flat timbersale area of Modoc National Forest. This location is six miles south of Medicine Lake. Timber Assistant Wes Hamilton lists the cut by timber species as follows: Ponderosa and sugar pine one million board feet; red and white fir three million. Hamilton reports defect, or cull, was heavy. This is a common situation in fir timber. Utilization of timber unsuitable for sawlogs, but still usable for pulp or chips poses a challenge to forest managers and industry alike. At present, cull sawlogs must be left to rot, but eventually with full development of utilization roads and more intensive industrial use, tops, limbs, and poor logs will pay their way to market.

Black Oak Can Be Successfully Dried

California black oak, a plentiful Western hard wood but an ornery timber to process, can be kiln dried satisfactorily from the kiln condition. This was accomplished at a series of tests at the University of California's Forest Products Laboratory.

Efforts in the past to utilize black oak have often ended in processing failures. Unless dried and conditioned just right, the wood tends to develop internal stresses, warps and splits, and the surface may develop checks. The new process may lead to wider use of the hard wood specie.

Outdoor Television Hero Described As Refreshing

NEW YORK (AP)—Buddy Ebsen, who plays the role of an outstanding woodsman of colonial days in the new television series "Northwest Passage," was ambushed the other day into describing his personal life in the woods and how to start a fire without matches.

"You take a couple of hot electrical wires," he said, "and touch their ends together and if you're lucky the sparks will eventually light something."

Ebsen, the most candidly refreshing TV outdoor hero who has yet crossed our wilderness path, confessed that his personal life in the woods has been confined to serving as outdoor consultant to his daughter's Brownie troop.

However, as Sgt. Hunk Marriner of Rogers' "Rangers in Kenneth Roberts' "Northwest Passage," making its debut on NBC-TV Sunday, he's the craftiest woodsman on the winning side of the French and Indian War.

Ebsen has three daughters, aged 9, 8 and 6, and one attractive wife (a Brownie mother) who accompanied him to New York and listened with growing horror as he described his life in the woods as outdoor consultant for her Brownie troop.

"I have here," he said, "a card identifying me as a Brownie outdoor consultant—and I got it just the way every other consultant got his. My wife said she had to take the Brownies to the woods for a weekend and a man had to be along."

"So I, along with 24 other Brownie fathers, enlisted in this course taught by a Brownie leader. First she showed us pictures of things like a guy up to his arm-pits in snow and she'd say, 'This is
