SALEM (AP) — More than one-third of Oregon's high school graduates go to college, a state Department of Education survey indicated today.

The survey included answers from 84 per cent of the 13,268 high school graduates in 1954. It showed that 37 per cent entered college and that 42 per cent of the 1954 graduates have now completed their military service.

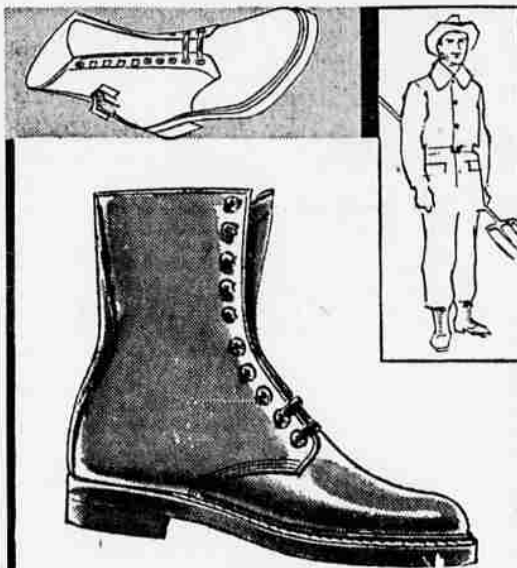
It showed that 66 per cent of the girls and 35 per cent of the boys are married.

Officer Objects To Picture Use

ROSEBURG (AP) — Charles S. Collins, Roseburg, president of the Oregon Wildlife Federation, today objected to the use of his picture in a leaflet described by him as political promotion for Gov. Robert D. Holmes.

Collins said his picture was used in the leaflet, showing a presentation to the governor in recognition of his proclamation pertaining to National Wildlife Week. The photograph, Collins said, is the property of the Wildlife Federation and was used in an "unauthorized manner." The federation president said he does not believe his endorsement should appear in any campaign literature. He said he is notifying member chapters that the photo should not be interpreted as an endorsement of Holmes, nor of his candidacy.

Besides, says Collins, he was improperly identified as an officer of the Izaak Walton League.
