### Weathermen See Reversal

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Weather Bureau said today the next 30 days will bring a reversal of the weather pattern of the past 30. The East will be warmer, much of the West cooler.

The bureau said its 30-day outlook for mid-September to mid-October calls for temperatures to average above seasonal normals in the southeastern quarter of the nation, Texas, and in the area from the Ohio Valley eastward through the Middle Atlantic States.

The bureau added: "Near normal temperatures are indicated for New England and states bordering the eastern Great Lakes. Over the west half of the country below normal temperatures are anticipated, except for above normal along the West Coast. This country-wide temperature pattern marks a reversal from that of the past 30 days when unseasonably cold weather dominated the East and warm weather the West."

"Precipitation is expected to exceed normal over most of the area lying between the Appalachians and the Continental Divide. Subnormal amounts are expected over the Southeast and far Southwest. Otherwise about normal precipitation is indicated."

### Monster Rocket For Mars Could Be Ready Very Soon

DETROIT (AP)—A monster team of rockets with power enough to boost a one-ton space capsule toward Mars could be within reach in little more than a year.

That's the indication from the men who make powerhouses for most of the major U.S. military missiles.

Scientists at Rocketdyne Division of North American Aviation, Inc., are working on two contracts for huge rocket complexes of 1 to 1½ million pounds thrust.

Either could boost a Mars-bound space bullet or land a 2,000-pound package on the moon.

Spokesmen for Rocketdyne, here for a meeting of the Rocket Society, told newsmen that the latest contract, announced last week by the Army, would be a sort of short cut. It calls for clustering several rocket engines like those that power U.S. 1,500-mile ballistic missiles such as the Thor and Jupiter.

It is the basic Rocketdyne engine that powers most of the U.S. missiles in operation or nearing operation. The engine develops 150,000 pounds of thrust. Ten of these in a proper cluster could develop 1½ million pounds of thrust.

The other contract for a huge rocket engine at Rocketdyne was let this summer by the Air Force. It calls for developing from scratch a new rocket engine with up to 1½ million pounds of thrust.

Four such engines bound together could carry a 31,000-pound satellite around the moon or put a 150,000-pound satellite into orbit around the earth some 300 miles high.

But George P. Sutton, chief of
