EUGENE (AP) — Eight members of the Eugene local of the Operating Engineers Union are suing the Roman Catholic Sisters of St. Joseph of Newark, operators of Sacred Heart Hospital here, and its administrator, sister M. Madeleine, for \$18,194. Clarence W. Shutt of Eugene, who filed the suit on behalf of himself and seven others, contends they lost their jobs because they joined the union. The complaint also states that the hospital broke a bargaining contract with the union and therefore owes the men wages from December. The other seven, the suit states, are: Charles Ketchum, Denny Maguire, Richard Klamesky, H. E. Richardson, Alvin J. Rose, Clarence Ludwig and O. D. Edgings.

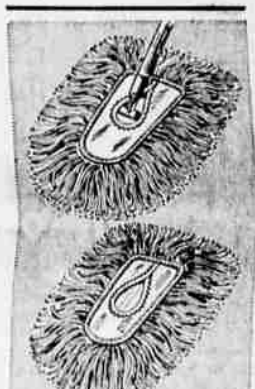

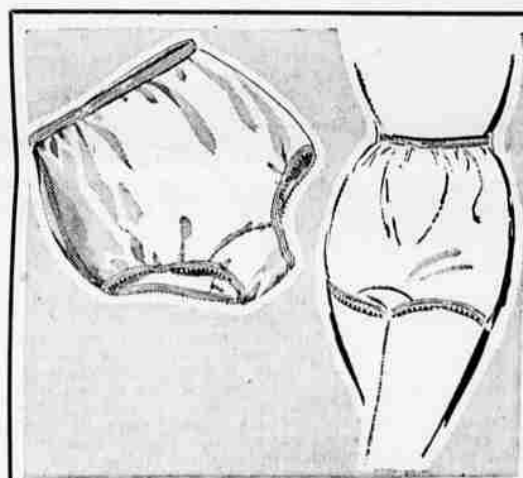

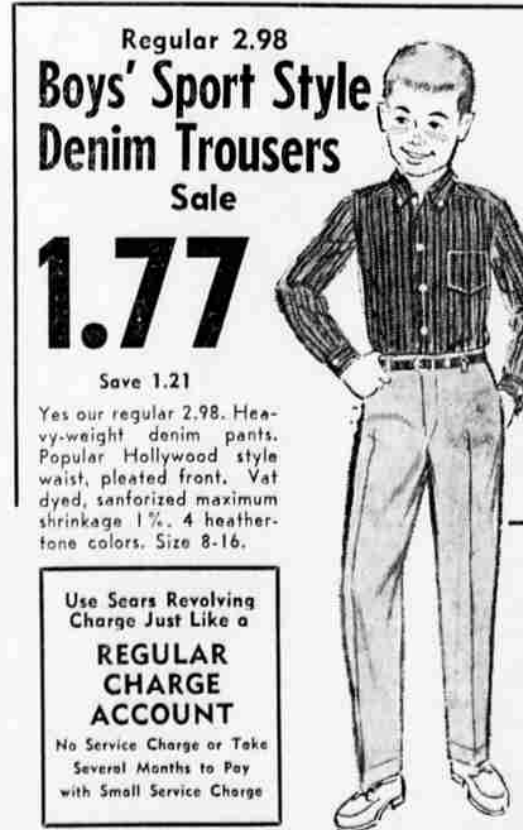
