### Bigger Success Sought By Skipper Of Raft Lehi

HONOLULU (UPI) — Devere Baker, 42, today looked ahead to a bigger adventure after successfully drifting on a raft from California to Hawaii on his fourth attempt.

Baker, a Mormon elder, was accompanied by three men and a mongrel pup on the 60-day voyage from Redondo Beach to Maui Island on the raft Lehi IV, which ended Saturday night.

Baker said he next was determined to go from the Mideast to Central America by raft as soon as possible. His objective is to substantiate a section of the Book of Mormon which says the Prophet Lehi used the drifting method to get the lost tribes of Israel from the Red Sea to Central America.

The trip just concluded, Baker

said, was to prove ancient peoples could have drifted from the American continent to populate the Hawaiian and other Pacific islands.

With Baker on the cruise were Larry Foglino, 28, a UCLA psychologist who served as navigator; Dan McFarland, 27, a graduate of Mexico City College; and Edward Kekaula, 27, of Honolulu, a pre-dental student at Brigham Young University. All were in good shape.

Baker and his companions left California July 5 aboard their 28 by 18-foot raft which cost \$30,000 to outfit. When they arrived they

had just two cans of stewed tomatoes and a can of spinach left. They ate mostly fish.

A fishing boat sighted the raft off Maui and towed it into Kahului harbor. Baker said he and the crew knew at all times where they were.

The pup, called Tangoroa (Tahitian for sea god), had been rescued from an animal shelter in California where he was to have been destroyed.

At Maui, the dog must be taken to the pound as soon as he is re-moved from the raft. Baker said he expressed hope someone would give the dog a second re-he and his friends didn't have a prievie.
