

Phone Man Hit By Car

A Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company employe sustained a broken hip and a broken leg Tuesday morning, when he was struck by an automobile while working on Highway 66, just west of Glene.

Gordon R. Darling, 28, 1318 N. Fitz Street, was reported as "resting well" Wednesday morning while he awaited surgery at Klamath Valley Hospital, where he was brought by Peace Ambulance following the accident.

State police report that Darling and his fellow worker, Jesse Hankins, had parked their pickup on the shoulder of the highway. The work they were doing required that Darling work next to the truck, right on the edge of the hard surface. It was while Darling was in this position that he was struck by a car driven by Steve H. Driscoll, 37, Box 265, Beatty. Police said Darling was knocked 40 feet by the impact.

Driscoll was lodged in Klamath County Jail on a charge of being drunk on a public highway, state police said, adding that the accident is still under investigation.


