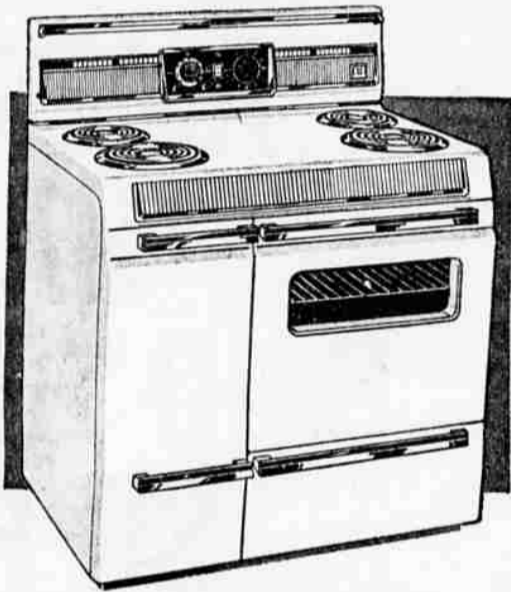

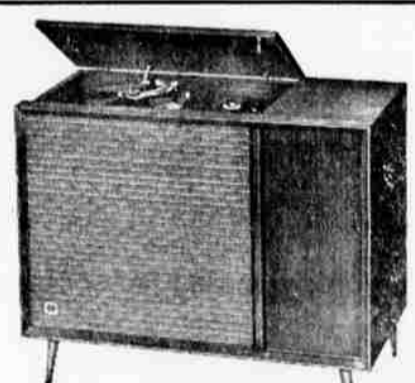

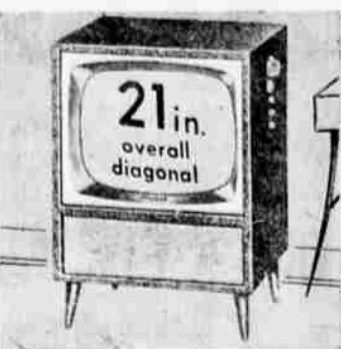

Local Church To Hear Talk

"Love, the Greatest Power," will be the topic of an address to be given by Glenn E. Smiley, national field secretary, Fellowship of Reconciliation, at the Congregational Church October 7. Time for the meeting is 7:45 p.m.

The speaker has traveled and lectured in 10 countries including Europe, Mexico, Canada and the United States. Having lived in the Southern states he has taken an active part in the struggle for integration of Negroes for the last three years, holding workshops on non-violence in Montgomery, Tallahassee, Columbia and Nashville, and the upper South.

He is a Texan, and a Methodist minister, served for 10 years in Arizona as a pastor and four years in that capacity in California before joining the staff of the Fellowship of Reconciliation.

Co-sponsors of his visit include the Klamath Council of Churches, the Klamath Falls Chapter NAACP and the Unitarian Fellowship of Klamath County.

The public is invited to hear the speaker.
