

Mayor Issues Proclamation

YREKA—A proclamation designating the week of October 11 through October 17 as National Business Women's Week was issued by Mayor Jim Cummings to the Yreka Business and Professional Women's Club.

The Yreka B.P.W.C. has, through its years of organization, assisted Girl Scout troops; annually sponsored the all-star 4-H girl of the year in Siskiyou County; contributed annually to a Philippine scholarship fund for women; and offered their time and assistance in various and worthwhile projects in the community throughout the year.

Each year they honor the junior high school girls with a dinner highlighted with women of varied professions who talk on the many careers and fields open for girls and women to better themselves.

Interchange Bid Set For Opening

Bids on construction of the three interchanges to be built to handle traffic flow through the west side bypass to Klamath Falls will be opened by the State Highway Commission on Tuesday, October 21.

Three structures are involved in the bidding. The three are the interchange over Nevada Avenue, the structure across the reclamation canal and the southwest leg interchange over the canal, all in Klamath Falls.

Continuation on the grading and paving of the highway itself is already underway and proceeding rapidly on the portion parallel to California Avenue.

The bid opening will be part of the letting of bids on 22 projects, costing about \$5,100,000 by the highway department.
