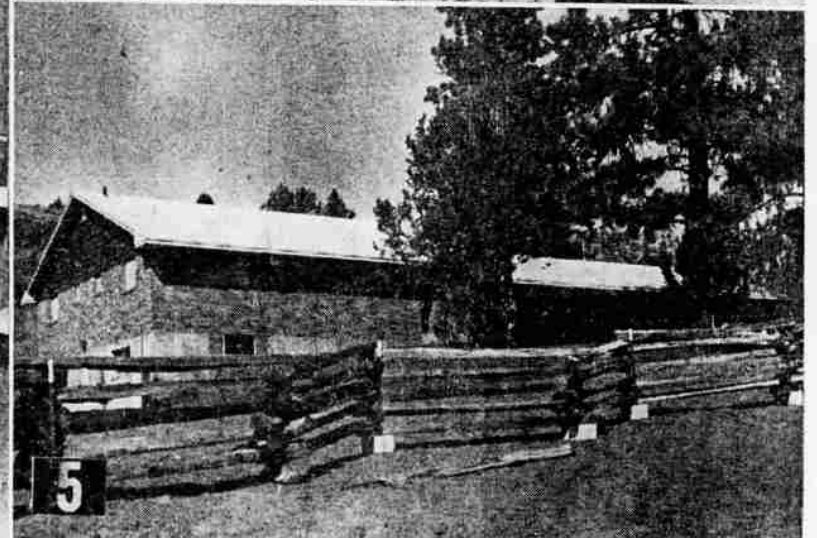
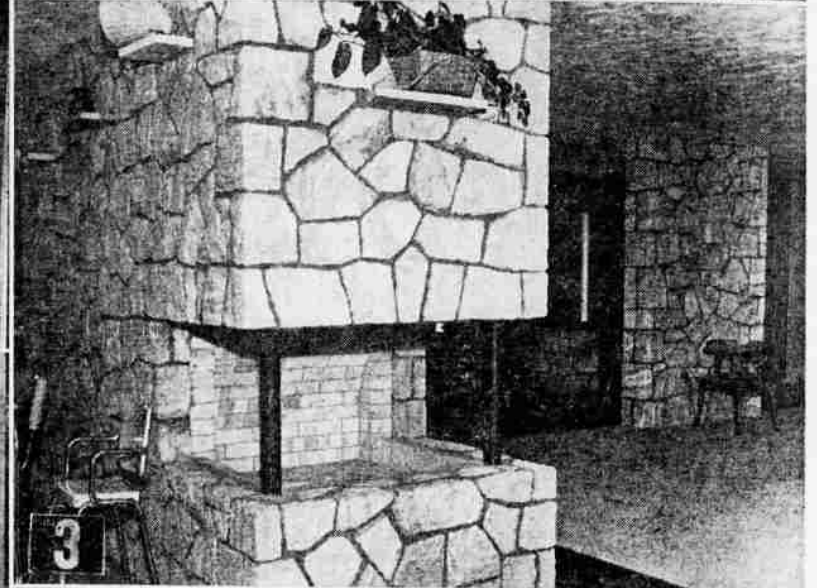




WOOD AND STONE and a naturally beautiful setting combine to make a dream house of the recently completed home of Dr. and Mrs. Fred Wedam at Pine Grove. (1) Mrs. Wedam holds an early American glass pitcher as she stands in front of the maple cupboard at the end of the dining room. Floor is flagstone and the window at right gives a view of the quiet pastoral scene. The pull-down lamp permits adequate lighting for reading at the table if desired. (2) Driveway approach to the house leads to the big entranceway at left center (in shadow). Mrs. Wedam and LaVerne Slusser are standing just beyond the overhang which provides protection from weather for guests and family entering or leaving the house. (3) Spacious living room has Montague stone for emphasis; just inside the entranceway for a base for the permanent plants; as one short wall and for the fireplace wall which divides the living room and family room. The opposite end of the fireplace shown is the oven

wall in the kitchen. (4) Counter high island doubles the amount of work space in the kitchen. The island cabinets are accessible from both sides and the hanging shelves above are useful as well as ornamental. Color highlight of the room is the pink porcelain sink, drop-in stove units, dishwasher front, and (not visible in the picture), double ovens and refrigerator, all by Frigidaire. The refrigerator's interior is turquoise porcelain and the turquoise and pink are picked up in the linoleum pattern, all of which harmonize with the natural hardwood throughout. (5) A split rail fence adds an authentic touch to the ranchtype atmosphere of the Wedam house. This picture was taken from left front and shows the grade contour permitting planning to include the big recreation area with bedrooms above. Living and dining areas are center and right from this angle.

Ranch Home Answer To Pine Grove Couple's Dream

"We built our dream house," Mrs. Fred Wedam declares when she talks about their lovely new home in Pine Grove.

"It took a long, long time to find the perfect site for the house we wanted to build and we feel we were mighty fortunate to be able to buy 40 acres in such a lovely spot."

It is indeed a lovely spot and their ranch type home combines so many elements of comfortable living in addition to beauty.

Dr. and Mrs. Wedam have four lively children and they were pro-

vided a big playroom of their own with spacious bedrooms above, taking advantage of the contour of the land to make one part of the house split level. There is a big yard for their pets and outdoor playthings.

Montague stone has been used in the house as a bold contrast to natural hardwoods. An air of spaciousness prevails, assisted by the free flowing planning of one room into the next. Flagstone floors are easy to care for and are a point of decorative interest in themselves.

The kitchen was planned by Mrs. Wedam, assisted by LaVerne Slusser, home service director of Cascade Home Furnishings.

Pink porcelain appliances were chosen after the general kitchen arrangement was decided upon. For convenience and to gain the greatest amount of utility from the space, the sink, dishwasher and drop-in stove units (all of pink porcelain) were established in an island through the center of the room. The double ovens are set into the end of the Montague stone

wall which is the fireplace wall dividing the living area and the family room. The ovens are pink porcelain with light grey porcelain interior. The pink porcelain refrigerator, also by Frigidaire has a turquoise blue porcelain interior. A touch of pink in the Montague stone and the confetti patterned linoleum pick up the pink porcelain. There is also an echo of turquoise in the floor covering.

The Wedams' lovely home is one more proof of the trend toward more gracious living in the Klamath Basin.
