Special Events Being Booked At Mt. Shasta Ski Bowl

DUNSMUIR—Special events are being booked for the month of October at the new Mt. Shasta Ski Bowl Lodge, even though the lodge, roof and chair lift are not officially open. On Wednesday, the Siskiyou County Board of Supervisors made an inspection trip to see the 400 car parking area and the approach to the lodge which will be officially included in the Siskiyou County road system and subject to snow clearing and maintenance. They indicated they will take this official action at the board meeting next Tuesday. Heron Engineering Company of Denver is installing the one and one half miles of double chair lift rising from the 7,850 elevation to approximately the 9,850 level. Cable installation will begin this week. The access road under construction to the lodge site from the city of Mount Shasta is about 14 miles long. Jess Briggs, contractor, has the road about 95 per cent complete. He is handling the eager visitors as graciously as possible but is not yet encouraging full use of the road. Less than a week of blacktopping work remains to be done and the road work is sufficiently complete that crews are no longer concerned about a break in the weather.

The first large group to use the facility was the Tri-State Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen Convention held in Dunsmuir last weekend. About 400 delegates and their wives attended a banquet of the lodge on Saturday night and returned for breakfast Sunday morning and a tour of the area. The chair lift was not in operation and chair installation and testing will take about one more week. The sportswriters and newsmen will be given a special preview at a press weekend on November 23-26. The Siskiyou County Chamber of Commerce will host this event. The lodge and lift will not be open for use by the general public until sometime in November. A big grand opening is slated for November 27, 28, 29 and 30. Reservations are not being taken for Thanksgiving dinner at the lodge.
