

Chief Seeking Aid For GOP

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower apparently is going out after support for Republican congressional candidates from independents and voters he calls discerning Democrats.

He hasn't defined exactly what a discerning Democrat is. But party leaders judge from what he has said recently that the President, in his forthcoming personal campaigning, plans some strong appeals to Democrats with conservative leanings.

With Eisenhower's approval the Republican National Committee has been pounding away on the theme that most of the Democrats running for Senate and House seats in the North and West are "left-wing radicals."

Eisenhower himself has suggested that the alternative to electing Republicans may be "radical government."

This strategy obviously has been based on the knowledge that registered Democrats outnumber Republicans in many critical states. Unless some of the independents and conservative Democrats can be lured over to the GOP column, a number of Republican candidates will be in a bad fix.

Eisenhower had some happy experiences in collecting independent and Democratic votes in 1952 and 1956.

But whether he can make his charm work by proxy this year—when he isn't running—remains to be demonstrated.

Sen. Olin D. Johnston (D-SC), who tried unsuccessfully to get Eisenhower to run for president as a Democrat in 1948, said he thinks the President's campaigning will help Democrats.

"Everywhere President Eisenhower makes a speech a Democrat rather than a Republican will be elected to Congress, particularly near the South," Johnston said in an interview.

Eisenhower leaves Friday on a major Western swing which will take him to Cedar Rapids, Iowa; Abilene, Kan.; then after a Denver weekend to Los Angeles, San Francisco and Chicago.

Experts Eye Radioactivity

WASHINGTON (AP)—The great majority of foods covered in a special study show no significant increases in radioactivity since 1945, the Food and Drug Administration reported today.

However, certain sea foods, dairy products and tea did show increased radioactivity. None was found to be dangerous.

The findings were made in a comparison of pre-1945 food samples with more recent samples.

The year 1945 marked the advent of the atomic age, with explosion of the first atomic bombs.

Edwin P. Laug and Wendell C. Wallace of FDA summed up results of the two-year study in a report for the annual convention of the Assn. of Official Agricultural Chemists.

Studies are continuing to determine the degree to which foods may become further contaminated with radioactive fallout.

Capital City Not Off Limits

SALEM (AP)—Salem isn't off limits to the Russians after all. Gov. Robert D. Holmes said Tuesday that the State Department said it had made an error last week in saying that Russians couldn't visit Salem.

So that means Igor Besrodni, a Russian pianist, will be able to play here March 11.

Ex-Oregonian Arrested By FBI

LAS VEGAS (AP)—The FBI Tuesday arrested a former Oregon man charged with draft evasion.

The FBI said he is George W. Vaughn, 24, an engineer and a graduate of Oregon State College. Agents said that Vaughn, who had registered at Roseburg, Ore., had refused to submit to induction into the military services in Oregon.

The charge against Vaughn was returned by a federal grand jury in Portland.

Vaughn, who had lived here about a year, was arraigned and held on \$1,000 bail.

Salem Struck By Merchant

SALEM (AP)—A Portland businessman, Ralph V. McDonald, picketed the capitol Tuesday. He said that Gov. Robert D. Holmes and Motor Vehicles Director James Johnson had put him out of business when Johnson's department suspended his driver's license.

McDonald, who said he operates McDonald Enterprises in Portland, said he couldn't run his business because he can't drive his truck.

Motor Vehicle Department records show that McDonald, who sells Wallboard, scaffolding and stone, had seven traffic violations and 10 accidents from 1942 to 1953.

His license was suspended for 30 days last June. He was convicted June 27 of driving with a suspended license, which resulted in a year's suspension.

McDonald's placard said: "Gov. Holmes and Johnson close McDonald Enterprises, small business of Portland."

Tailor Preparing Robes For 3 Prospective Popes

ROME (AP)—"Nineteen years ago," said Bonaventura Gammarelli, "everybody knew who would be coming out of the conclave as the new pontiff. But now, things are different."

"In 1939, it just had to be either Cardinal Pacelli (chosen Pope Pius XII) or Cardinal Maglione, and I tailored the pontifical robes according to their measurements. Today, there are many names."

The papal robes must be ready for their new wearer soon after his election. But Gammarelli, official purveyor to the apostolic see, seemed hardly worried.

"I am preparing three sizes," he explained. "One ought to fit the new pontiff."

His chief cutter was brandishing a super-sized pair of scissors and following a brown cardboard pattern placed on a large piece of white moire silk.

"This will be a pontifical cassock," Gammarelli explained. "It was on the same table that I tailored the robes for our late Pope in 1939."

The Gammarellis have been tailors for the princes of the church since 1798. Beside the wide shelves in his workshop, filled to capacity with bales of precious cloth and silk, hang pictures of various pontiffs, awarding a Gammarelli the title of official purveyor.

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Old War Cannon Search Object

DORCHESTER, S.C. (AP)—Officers are looking for a 600-pound Revolutionary War cannon that disappeared as the night winds from Hurricane Helene swept through the community.

But no storm carried off the massive historical marker. "It couldn't have been handled by less than three men," said the sheriff's department, "and indications are they used a wrecker crane to lift the cannon."

The four-foot cannon was valued at \$10 as junk but was "priceless" historically.

Candidates Hold Many Degrees

LOS ALAMOS, N.M. (AP)—The roll of candidates for county office in the atomic laboratory county of Los Alamos reads almost like the faculty roster of a university.

Of the candidates listed by the League of Women Voters, six are doctors of philosophy, three have law degrees, one holds a master's degree and eight have bachelor's degrees from college.
