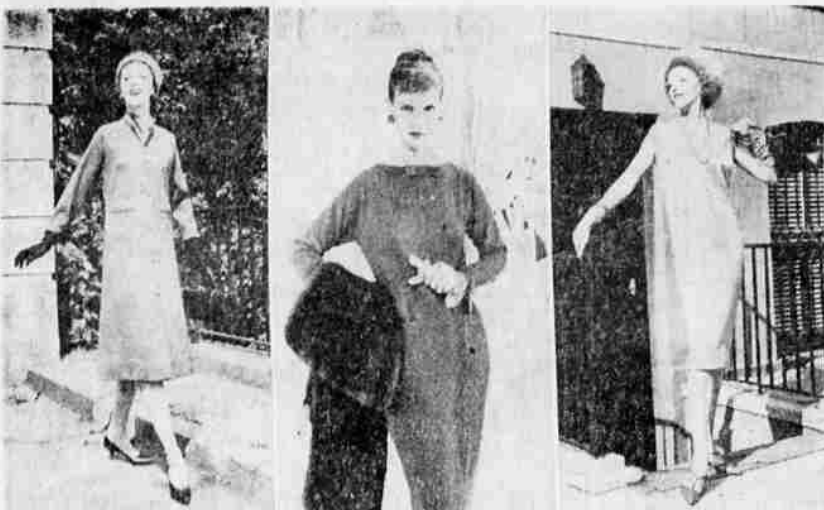




**WOOLKNIT** in the new styles shows a trapeze coat in woolknit at left. The modified trapeze line gives a gentle grace to this handsome coat in red or black woolknit by Goldform. Raglan sleeves and the interesting pointed yoke that forms the collarless v-cut neckline are accentuated with an open dropstitch insert. A raised waistline is suggested by the high-placed pockets and ribbed cuffs. Center is a wonderful go-anywhere-anytime dress in a relaxed sheath. Hip-level twin pockets pinpoint the eased waistline and a flat self-bow is posed at the attractive cross-over neckline. At right, is the new, relaxed, sleeveless jumper in fine zephyr wool. It's different, because it falls into supple, natural figure-lines that only the all-American wool fiber can achieve. Designed by lone Innes of Catalina in a variety of colors, it creates different costume effects when worn with blouses or sweaters and can solo for more formal occasions.

## WANDERING WAISTLINE IN FALL WOOLKNITS

Where, oh, where has our wandering waistline gone? It's way up, way down, somewhere in between, or not there at all in the newest woolknit fashions designed for Fall. But no matter where it settles, or doesn't, plant woolknit (with its fluid give-and-take) does more for the figure in every silhouette than any fashion ever created.

Dresses and coats take a willow line to fashion with strategically placed pockets suggesting either the raised or dropped waistline. Roomy twin pockets are low-slung on a seven-eighths length walking coat in a lustrous brushed mohair, while high-ribbed pockets take an Empire pose on a modified trapeze coat in a fine gauge woolknit.

Unbelled, sheath-like silhouettes appear in both dresses and coats, but even though they may bypass the waistline, the flexible woolknit always makes them superbly shapely. The fiber is so resilient that it adds an attractive shapely ripple here and there while the body is in action.

Wool jersey, surprisingly water-repellent, has double-wardrobe-utility, proving equally attractive for rain as it is for sunny days in town. A new jersey topcoat with a multiple personality has a button-off collar that drops down into a cowl collar, converts into a pretty bonnet, hood or kerchief cap. It can even be draped into a turban.

Mohair, Fall '58's fashion pet, has gone long-hair. Brushed to a fluffy cloud, used alone or blended with wool, it makes dresses and coats of delectable softness. In a loop knit, from the tiniest loop to outsize bulky ones, it possesses a frothy, soufflé quality. Strong and long, the mohair fiber has a superb affinity for dyes, reproducing
