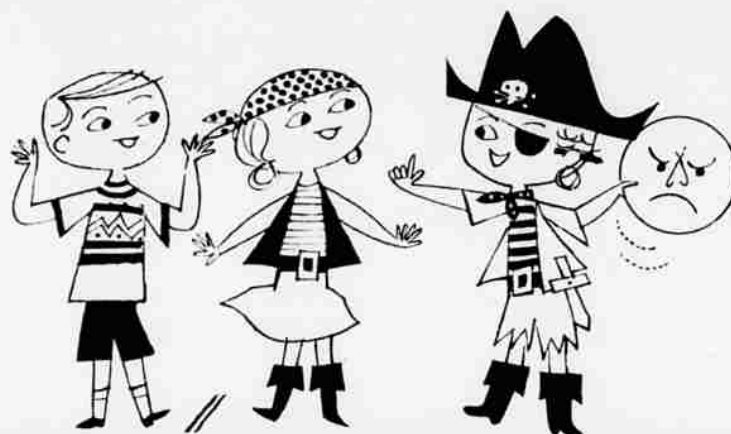

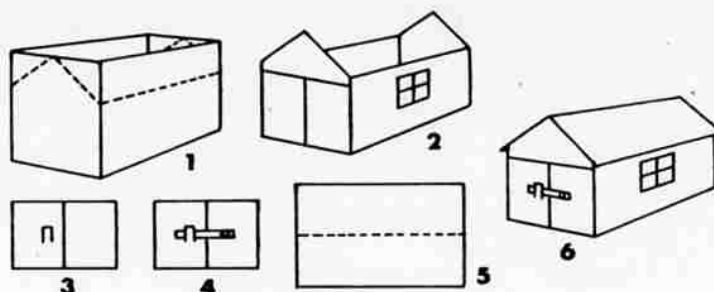

A Toy Garage Bess A. Lee

You can make a garage for your toy automobiles from a cardboard box. Choose one that is longer than it is wide and quite deep. Cut the ends of the box into a point and cut a strip from each side as shown by dotted lines in Fig. 1. Draw a little square window at each side and at one end with black crayon. To make the doors, draw a straight line across the other end about three-quarters of an inch below the top corners. Measure the center and draw a vertical line to the bottom (Fig. 2). Cut on these lines and bend back the pieces to open the doors. To make the latch, cut a slot near the edge of one door (as in Fig. 3) with a knife; then cut a strip of cardboard and fasten onto the other door exactly opposite the slot with a two-pronged paper fastener so it can move up and down and slide in and out of the slot. For the roof, measure the sloping side at one end of the box and cut a piece of cardboard a little more than twice this width and about one inch longer than the box. Measure the center lengthwise, draw a line, bend and place on top of the box. You can paste red or green paper over the roof or paint it with a bright color to make an attractive finish.

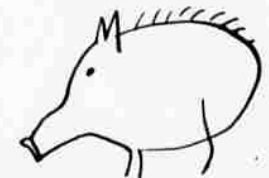

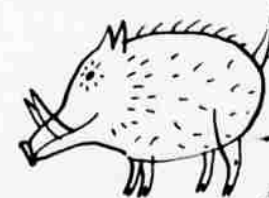
