

Top Red Aide Feared Dead

LONDON (UPI) — Conviction deepened here today that a high Soviet official may have been aboard the Soviet TU104 jet airliner which crashed last Friday, killing the 65 passengers and five or more crewmen aboard.

Radio Moscow still has not amplified its Saturday statement all aboard were dead. But Radio Peiping said there were 65 passengers aboard, 16 of them Chinese Communist officials, and the remainder non-Chinese.

Russia was silent on the identity of the victims, but the Soviet cabinet, in an unprecedented move, decreed that a top level panel should investigate the crash at Kanash, 260 miles east of Moscow. The crash came during a scheduled Peiping-Moscow flight.

Because of the Soviet cabinet's intervention in the crash investigation and the almost unprecedented announcement of the disaster, Western experts speculated that high Communist or foreign officials might be among the victims.

Peiping named its 16 victims who included Cheng Chen-to, vice minister of cultural affairs, who was leading a cultural delegation of 10 to Afghanistan. It merely described the others as "foreign friends" and "foreign experts."

Official sources in Bonn and London said four West Germans and one Briton were aboard the aircraft. The Cambodian Embassy in Tokyo said it had no knowledge of Moscow rumors the son of the Cambodian ambassador to Peiping was a passenger.

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Shirley Saunders and Bob Kardell are honeymooning today, thanks to an electronic brain and television. Herbert G. Dorsey and Dominick Suniga, both 16, built the 15-footer, stocked it with provisions and left on the cruise Saturday with their parents' blessings.

Then Mrs. Suniga changed her mind. She telephoned police, who put the Coast Guard on the trail. The boys turned around voluntarily when they learned Mrs. Suniga was worried.

Young Dorsey was returned home from Hawaii three months ago after stowing away on a liner.

Dedication Held For Old Church

LONDON (UPI) — Queen Elizabeth and other members of the royal family took part Sunday in the dedication of the rebuilt Old Church of St. Clement Dane's, which gave its name to the Elizabethan nursery rhyme, "Oranges and lemons say the bells at St. Clement's."

The three-century-old church, destroyed in 1942 by a German bomb, was reconsecrated as central chapel of the Royal Air Force. The \$30,000 organ used in the inaugural services was donated by U. S. airmen in Britain.

Hotel Strike Voting Slated

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Some 2,300 striking employees of five Pittsburgh hotels will vote soon on whether to accept a new contract proposal.

A 35-member negotiating committee of Local 237, Hotel and Restaurant Workers, agreed Sunday to place the new proposal before the membership but did not immediately announce when the vote will be taken.

Attending the Local 237 meeting were officers of striking Local 188 of the Bartenders Union.

The 20-day strike affects the Penn-Sheraton, Pittsburgh, Roosevelt, Sherwyn and Webster Hall hotels.

The offer reportedly gives non-tip employees wage hikes of 5 cents an hour this year, 4½ cents next year and 4 cents more in 1960. Tip employees, now working 48 to 44 hours a week, would work only 40 hours a week without loss in pay. The proposed pact also reportedly includes a pension offer.

"Get me away from here before he kills me," she screamed. Boese fired another shot as the car pulled away. It tore out the rear window, scattering glass over Mrs. Boese, the Mitchells and their three young children. None of them were hurt by it.

Mitchell stopped at a gasoline station and called for an ambulance and the police.

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For two months, the Soviet leader has been resting at government dachas (villas) on the Black Sea near Yalta and Sochi. Some people may think that for the Communist Party chief and premier of a new power such as Russia, this is an unusually long vacation.

Actually, ever since he departed for the south in mid-August, Khrushchev has combined relaxation and business. Between dips in the sea, sunbathing and strolls in the countryside, he has continued to attend countless party affairs which are the legitimate concern of the country's highest Communist.

IN CONSTANT TOUCH

Geographically, he is about 720 miles from Moscow. Yet, by telephone and teletype, he is only a few minutes away and in constant touch with the latest developments in domestic and foreign affairs.

At the same time, Khrushchev has received numerous foreign officials and private visitors, including East German leaders and American singer Paul Robeson, industrialist Cyrus Eaton and movie czar Eric Johnston.

Early in September, Khrushchev interrupted his vacation and returned to Moscow to preside over a session of the central committee on economic affairs.

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Several days ago, he left his dacha in the picturesque mountain resort of Sochi to journey to Stavropol where he awarded the region the Order of Lenin for agricultural achievements. Displaying his customary energy and colorful language, the premier addressed a large assembly of collective farmers, praising them for their contribution to the 1958 record grain harvest.

UNBELIEVABLE GROWTH

Khrushchev urged the farmers to redouble their efforts, and predicted the Soviet economy will undergo "an unbelievable" expansion during the forthcoming seven-year plan.

He said that when figures for the plan are published "the whole world will be amazed at the prospective development of the socialist economy."

From Stavropol, Khrushchev continued his tour of the southern

agricultural country to the Krasnodar and Rostov regions where he awarded more Orders of Lenin.

The Soviet leader was expected to continue touring and gradually make his way back to Moscow as he arrives back in the toward the end of the month. It capital.
