Most of our visitors come either from Oregon, or from the neighboring states, but once in a while we can boast of a traveler from the other side of the world. Last month we had visitors from Norway; this month from London and South Wales.

Groups of our own children are beginning to come in to make a tour of the museum. Girl Scouts, Cubs and Brownies have all been in within recent weeks, and all are welcome. A call to the museum a day or so before such a tour is planned will insure that the curator has time to conduct the group around the museum and help avoid having two groups arrive together.

Among the items of special interest now on display is a copy of the Klamath Express for January 10, 1895. For those people who are always asking where the falls in Klamath Falls are, the question is answered. A picture of the river and the falls is on the back page, and the front page describes the town as having a population of 600, four general stores, two drug stores, one furniture store, three hotels, one barber shop, two confectionery stores, three livery stables, two blacksmith shops, one planing mill, three saloons, and one church, Presbyterian.

Alfalfa hay was selling at \$4 a ton, cattle at \$17 a head, and city lots in Merrill at \$25 to \$50 each. The Linkville Hotel could be purchased for \$8,000, for which sum the new owner would possess 30 rooms, a barroom, stables and all other conveniences. Wheat sold at 85 cents a hundred, wool from six to eight cents, and horses were nearly worthless.
