Army Cites Basin Man

A division commander's certificate of achievement has been presented to 1st. Lt. Norman S. Parker, Klamath Falls man, who has been cited for meritorious service while assigned to Mortar Battery, 1st Battle Group, 5th Cavalry, 1st Cavalry Division during the period, November 1957 to June 1958.

The officer, son of Mrs. George R. Parker, 1110 1/2 MonClaire, this city, served 16 months in Korea. He entered the service after graduation from Klamath Union High School and Oregon State College where he majored in agriculture.

The citation further said that, "in the performance of his responsibilities Lieutenant Parker has brought credit upon himself and his battery, which achieved the highest scores attained by any battery in Korea during the recently conducted Army training tests. Rice Dealings Nearing End

SEATTLE (AP)—Burma's rice barter deals with Communist China, the Soviet Union and Communist bloc nations in Eastern Europe appear to be nearing an end.

U Kaung Tin, head of Burma's delegation of experts to the Colombo Plan economic conference here, disclosed today that his country is slowly reducing such trade.

"From next year on we do not have to sell them anything for barter," he said. "There is a larger cash demand now for rice than Burma is able to produce."

Burma, the greatest rice-exporting nation in the world, originally arranged to barter a third of its total rice exports to the Sino-Soviet bloc. Over the past two years this has been reduced to about 10 per cent.

Other sources said Burma was disgruntled several years ago at evidence that rice being bartered to Czechoslovakia was being sold in turn for cash to normal customers of Burma.

U.S. sources said they do not anticipate a total suspension of the rice trade because Burma is still obligated to pay for a stadium and a hospital being built by the Soviet Union in Rangoon.

Lakeview Court Business Good

LAKEVIEW — Business in this court is growing by leaps and bounds, according to Justice of the Peace O. C. Gibbs of Lakeview.

This is evident in the increase in fines collected this year, and especially during the past three months.

During July, August and September, and up to October 20, a total of \$10,278.56 has been collected. Of this, in the first 20 days of October, there was \$3,159 collected. So far, in the calendar year of 1958, there have been fines of approximately \$14,900, as against round figures of \$8,800 for the full year of 1957.
