Candidates Give Talks

Candidates for county and state offices were present Tuesday night at a voters school sponsored by the Bonanza Farm Bureau, held in the Bonanza Library.

Keynoting the meeting was the topic of County Judge Chauncey Mack's talk, "The Responsibility of Being an Informed Voter," in which he said, "Citizens who fail to vote and who are complacent about qualifications of candidates for public office represent a threat to America."

E. A. Geary, former Oregon state legislator, explained the measures on the November ballot and Judge Mack outlined the history of road improvements in the county since 1948 when a three-mile levy was voted in.

Candidates were given an opportunity to give their qualifications for office.

Lakeview Police Handle Juveniles

LAKEVIEW — Two bail checks for \$200 each were received here October 20 from the district court at Bend, Oregon, according to District Attorney Julian Herndon. They were for Larry Merrill, Lejuel and Jeffrey Lawrence Stoddard who had been arrested on a complaint filed by Ernest Hoagler and charged with the destruction of a finger signboard on the Cook-Wall Road in Lake County on August 21, 1950.

Rogers is in charge of road signs for the Oregon State Highway Commission. The warrant was issued by Justice of the Peace O. C. Gibbs on motion of the district attorney. The case will be submitted to the grand jury.

Three young men, Terry Conway, 17, and Sherman Jennings, 18, of Lakeview were taken last week to the jail following sentence by Justice Gibbs to six months in the jail when found guilty to a charge of burglarizing a store.

They were arrested in Layton, California and returned here under the custody of Chief of Police Frank Andrei and Deputy Sheriff Lin Jones of Lakeview. They were also charged with the taking of a car from the Lange Motors showroom in Lakeview. Town officers Wayne Greel and Don Stover surprised the boys and found they had in their possession a suitcase full of guns and ammunition which they had taken from Gil Lin's Sporting Goods Store.

Police Chief Frank Andrei said Tuesday that contact had been made with the Washington institution but officials there refused to provide funds for their return. The boys are being held in the city jail here.

On Monday afternoon, Officer Greel picked up Rev. A. Bohann and he is being held for the shooting of John Day, Oregon. He held on a felony warrant with bail of \$1,000.
