LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP)—Two men have begun their second attempt to stay aloft two months in a light plane.

Robert Timm, 33, a Las Vegas hotel employe, and Charles Kaskela, 32, an Anaheim, Calif., aircraft worker, took off Thursday. They want to break the 50-day endurance record for single-engine planes.

A previous try this month ended after 18 hours because of carburetor trouble.
