Ike To Close GOP Drive

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower, back from a three-state campaign tour, will close his drive for election of a Republican Congress with a nationwide television-radio address from Baltimore Friday night.

There had been talk that Rockefeller, a former foreign policy aide to Eisenhower, was something less than happy about having the President campaigning in the state.

Rockefeller joined Keating in telling enthusiastic audiences of GOP workers that they as the ticket leaders were happy Eisenhower came to New York — and that his visit had helped them.

There were 300 to 400 campaign workers on hand as planned at each of the two party rallies at which Eisenhower did speak in New York. He hit out at the Democrats again, but not nearly so sharply as he did in Pennsylvania and West Virginia—and in California and Chicago last week.
