Judging Test Results Told

YREKA—Ninety four boys participated in the livestock judging contest which took place at the fair at McArthur, California, recently. The Future Farmers of America Chapter of the Yreka High School captured the Inter-mountain first.

The contest consisted in judging and explaining reasons for judging beef cattle, swine and sheep, with Bruce Root as high scorer of the contest; Stanley Sears, third high; and Curtis Harding, fifth high. These boys are students at Yreka High School. Their combined score of 1,133 placed them first, over Susanville's 1,133 points.

Points in individual judging placed Root third in sheep and third in beef; Sears, first in swine and seventh in sheep; Harding, fourth in sheep, fifth in beef.

Roland Elsea, son of Mr. and Mrs. James Elsea, Montague, and a student at Yreka High School, placed fifth high scorer out of 30 boys participating in the farm mechanics competition.

Legal Office To Hear Beefs

PORTLAND (AP) — U.S. Atty. E. C. Luckey said the Portland federal attorney's office, like those elsewhere in the nation, will be open until 8 p.m. election day to hear any complaints about election law violations.

Luckey said Thursday this would allow a quick investigation of any complaints. He said most election matters are state laws, but some are subject to federal jurisdiction.



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Remarks Made In Museum Mystifying To Englishmen

LONDON (AP) — It's a small world these days, Americans travel a lot, and the U.S. election campaign has spilled over into Madame Tussaud's Waxworks.

"We get quite a few Americans in here," said a guide. "Often upon seeing Mr. Truman, one will say, 'Give him hell, Harry.' Another American will speak up, saying, 'Give it right back to him, Ike.' This is rather mystifying."

At Tussaud's, the wax likeness of President Eisenhower stands to the fore in the U.S. statesmen's group. His right hand is raised, as though making a point in a speech.

Former President Truman stands against the rear wall with his left hand in his pants pocket. He has the attitude of a man impatiently jingling a bunch of keys. He appears to be looking quizzically at the back of Eisenhower's head.

Other presidents, shown in back, are Lincoln, Hoover, both Roosevelts, McKinley, Washington, Taft and Wilson. Others in the statesmen's group are William Penn and Benjamin Franklin.

There are 347 individual wax effigies in Tussaud's at the moment, and apart from the 12 statesmen only 6 are Americans.

Louise Brough, three-time winner of the women's singles title at the Wimbledon Tennis Tournament, is the only American among the sporting celebrities.

In the "renowned stage and screen" group only Marilyn Monroe, Bob Hope and Danny Kaye have made the grade, and Hope was born in England.

A recent arrival among contemporary military leaders is U.S.

Gen. Lauris Norstad, NATO's supreme commander in Europe.

The other Americans are in the chamber of horrors. They are Charles J. Guiteau, who assassinated President Garfield, and a fellow most Americans have forgotten, named Kemmler.

The latter, it seems, went to the newly invented electric chair in New York in 1890 for murder—the first man ever to suffer legal electrocution. Tussaud's try to give credit where credit is due.

Prostitute Admits Plot

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Jay Martin, deputy district attorney, says a former prostitute has admitted that it was her idea to get a Baptist minister to go to bed with her in an extortion plot.

He said at a press conference Thursday that Mrs. Virginia McFerren, 28, and Ronald Lawrence, 30, admitted they plotted the alleged extortion but that Mrs. McFerren admitted she proposed the idea. He said her husband, whose name also is Ronald, and Lawrence agreed.

The third Ronald in the case, Dr. Ronald K. Adams, pastor of the Oakland First Baptist Church, told police the men attempted to extort \$6,000 from him after photographing him in bed nude with Mrs. McFerren. He resigned his pastorate, but his church has not yet accepted the resignation.

The McFerrens and Lawrence pleaded innocent when arraigned Thursday on attempted extortion in Municipal Court.

TRAVELING SCHOOL

STILLWATER, Okla. (AP)—A mobile physics laboratory—sponsored by Oklahoma State University—will permit 270 students in south-central Oklahoma to take physics for the first time this fall. The university pioneered a traveling chemistry laboratory in 1957 and will continue it this year. The services are for small schools with-out adequate resources and physical facilities to teach the science courses.

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
