Increase Noted In Waterfowl

TULELAKE — Waterfowl populations continue high on the Tule Lake and Lower Klamath National Wildlife refuges. Slightly more than two million ducks and a quarter million geese are still inhabiting Tule Lake. At Lower Klamath 2 1/4 million ducks and some 90,000 geese are still finding feeding, water and weather conditions ideal.
Hunting has been good, according to A. Vernon Ekedahl, refuge manager. At the close of the third week of the hunting season, 14,455 hunters had taken 33,905 ducks and 10,604 geese on the two areas for an average of 3.02 birds per man day of shooting.
Swans are beginning to arrive with 500 counted. By mid-November, thousands of the big birds will be winging across the marshes and hunters are warned to distinguish them from white or snow geese.

TYPHOON LORNA
MANILA (AP) — Typhoon Lorna, packing maximum 100 m. p. h. winds near the center, veered from the Philippines toward Okinawa today, leaving possibly seven dead and at least 1 1/2 million dollars in damage to crops and property. Hardest hit in the Philippines was the Bicol region in southern Luzon.

Utah Could Be GOP Island Isolated By Democrat Sea

SALT LAKE CITY (UPI)—Utah has contended the Democrats will control the next Congress and that Utah will lack full representation if it fails to elect a Democrat.
However, the state's solidly GOP congressional delegation faces a stiff test because of a unique three-way race for the U. S. Senate and primary election results which gave Democrats a majority of the votes for the first time in six years.
The Senate contest was made a three-cornered affair when ex-Gov. J. Bracken Lee entered the fray as an independent candidate against Democrat Frank E. Moss and incumbent GOP Sen. Arthur V. Watkins.
Lee became a "man without a party" in 1956 when he left the GOP after being defeated for re-nomination to an unprecedented third term as governor. He then sought the governorship on an independent ticket but again was defeated.
The former governor blamed Watkins for engineering his political demise in the 1956 campaign, and the two have been political enemies ever since.
Lee has openly sought to attract a protest vote by campaigning against both parties, advocating outright abolition of the federal income tax and sharp reductions in foreign aid.
Moss, president of the National Association of County and Prosecuting Attorneys and a liberal,

Safety For Small Children Provided By New Statute

WASHINGTON (UPI)—A curly-haired 3-year-old boy climbed into a refrigerator and the door slammed shut.
His mother found him five hours later — dead. Tiny finger marks on the inside of the refrigerator door testified to his efforts to escape.
A federal law aimed at eventually ending such "ice box deaths" went into effect today.
The law requires that all refrigerators sold in interstate commerce must be constructed so a small child can open them from the inside.
Refrigerator doors must be built so they will open when:
—Not more than 15 pounds of pressure is applied from the inside where the handle is located.

ASK RATE HIKE

WASHINGTON (UPI) — American Airlines has asked the Civil Aeronautics Board for permission to hike its passenger fares 8.5 per cent to cover heavier costs in the jet age.

—Or, an inside knob requiring not more than five pounds of pressure is turned.
—Or, some automatic device requiring not more than 15 pounds of pressure operates.
Congress passed the law in 1950 and directed the administration to draw up specific requirements.
Many refrigerator manufacturers have been installing the required safety features for some time.
Government officials estimate more than a dozen children a

year on the average are trapped in refrigerators and ice boxes and die. The death toll in 1953 reached 26.
Most of the deaths have involved children becoming trapped in abandoned ice boxes or unused refrigerators. However some have involved refrigerators in use.
In only two days in 1953 nine children suffocated in two ice boxes in Virginia and Arkansas. In Philadelphia in 1955 one 5-year-old boy shut the door of a refrigerator in which two play-mates were sitting. Both suffocated.
A number of states have enacted laws banning disposal of old refrigerators with closeable doors. The federal law is aimed at a permanent solution.
As Rep. Kenneth A. Roberts (D-Ma.), a backer of the law, said in urging its passage: "The boxes we manufacture today will — unless we act now — be the coffins of tomorrow."

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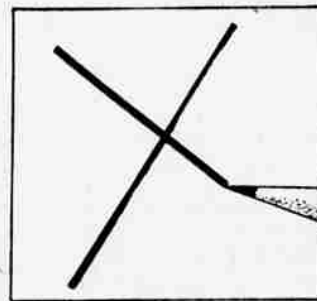
