## Politicians In Philippines Also Cater To The Ladies

NEW YORK (UPI) — Politicians cater to the woman voter in the Philippines as in the United States, says the islands' only lady senator.

Mrs. Pacita Madrigal Gonzalez says that in her homeland women make up 32 per cent of the total registered vote, and they make for some of the most ardent party workers at the local, district and national level.

"Very definitely, our women can swing any election," she said.

"Magsaysay (the late president) gave full credit to the women for putting him in."

Mrs. Gonzalez is the first woman in the Philippines has sent to the United Nations General Assem-

bly. From New York, she continues to Paris for the seventh general conference of UNESCO.

Any party would count this politician an asset. She's young, 41; she's smart — she attended a list of schools that long and graduated magna cum laude from the University of Santo Tomas. And she's pretty — small, with an excellent figure, good legs, and chic clothes.

Mrs. Gonzalez moved into politics when Ramon Magsaysay was running for the presidency. "Politics had been another world to me," she said, although her father had been a senator, representing the Liberal Party. She's a Nationalista.

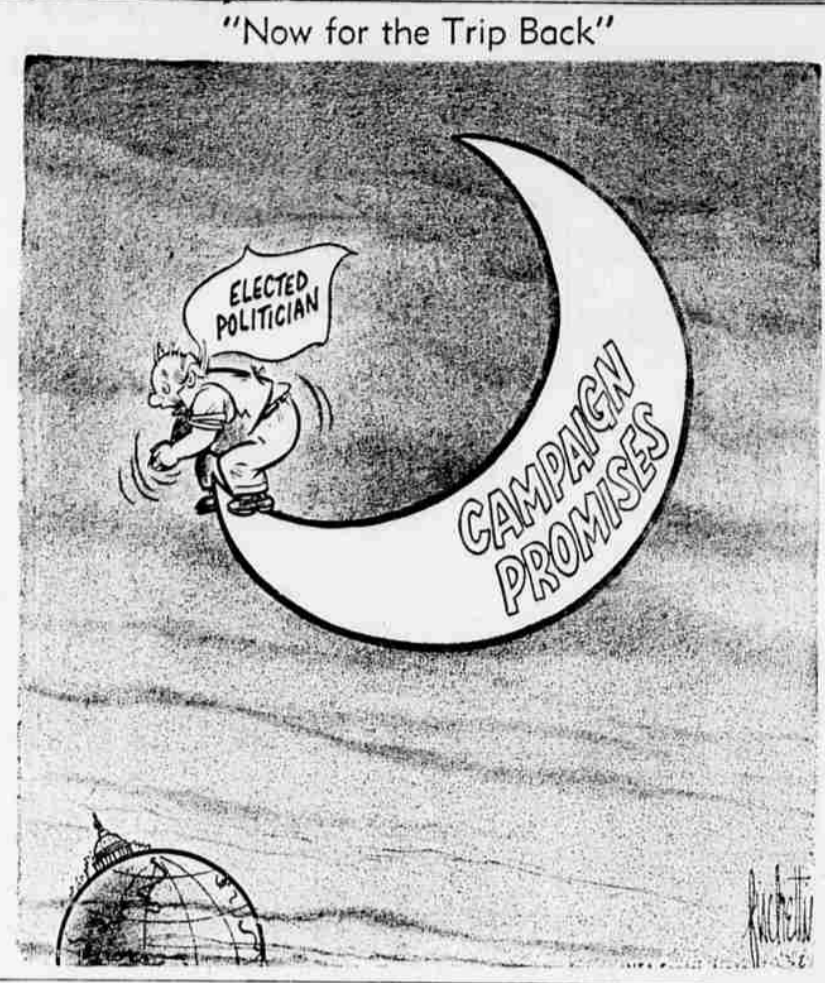
"I was more interested in ballet," said Mrs. Gonzalez.

But at Magsaysay's urging, she headed up the women's division of his campaign and after his election, was named to the cabinet, as social welfare administrator.

In 1953, she decided to run for the Senate and stomped the country like any other politician. "But no kissing babies," she laughed. "I save that for home." There are two children in the family, a 12-year-old son from her marriage to the late Herman Warns, and a 15-month-old daughter, by her husband, Gonzalo, an attorney.

Mrs. Gonzalez topped the party slate with a whopping margin of 300,000 more votes than any other candidate. She explained that in the Philippines eight senators are chosen each election, and all run as candidates at-large, instead of from a specific district, for a six-year term. Members of the lower house are selected by district.

The Philippines has only one woman in the House, but the ladies have moved rapidly into both elective and appointive public office since they won the right to vote in 1935, she said—serving as judges, mayors, councilmen, and on boards of education. The Philippines has one woman ambassador—to Vietnam.

**RAISE DISCOUNT RATES**  
WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Federal Reserve Board has authorized Federal Reserve banks in Boston and Kansas City to raise their discount rates from 2 to 2½ per cent effective today.

Only the New York and San Francisco reserve banks still are charging 2 per cent on loans to commercial banks. The board first authorized a 2½ per cent discount rate on Oct. 23. The increase was officially described as a "technical adjustment."

## New Mideast Crisis Looms As Iraq Leader Arrested

WASHINGTON (AP) — The arrest in Iraq of a former revolutionary leader with pro-Nasser leanings may spark a new crisis in the Middle East.

Baghdad radio announced Tuesday night that Col. Abdel Salam Aref had been seized and "will be tried on a charge of plotting against the country's interests."

Aref was a close associate of Premier Abdel Kerim Kassem in the first weeks of their rule following the overthrow of the regime of King Faisal in July.

Subsequently, Aref was removed from both top military and cabinet posts and was given an appointment as Iraqi ambassador to West Germany. He was arrested, the Baghdad radio announcement said, when he returned to Iraq's capital city without permission.

U.S. officials said there was no doubt that there had been a power struggle between the two men revolving around a critical issue of policy. Aref favored very close association or union with the United Arab Republic of President Gamal Abdel Nasser, while Kassem wanted and has followed a more independent policy based on neutralism in foreign relations.

Some authorities here thought that the seizure of Aref by Kassem's government might force some vigorous reaction from Nasser against that government or Kassem personally. But they commented also that if Nasser felt his prestige was not directly involved or the force of his Arab unity movement not impaired, he could choose to ignore the whole affair.

Experts said the action against Aref also could precipitate a political showdown inside Iraq. They reasoned that Kassem probably would not have acted unless he had been confident of his own power. But the possibility remained that his hand might have been forced by discovery of a plan for action against him on the part of Aref. Kassem suppressed early in October a military conspiracy allegedly involving Aref supporters.

The Middle East area has been relatively quiet for some weeks now, and U.S. and British troops have been withdrawn from Lebanon and Jordan, where they were sent after the Iraqi revolt.

But the political structures in several countries, including Jordan, are still very shaky and any sensational development in Iraq would almost certainly have repercussions throughout the area.

## 'Will Never Marry Actor' Says Filmland Divorcee

HOLLYWOOD (UPI)—This year will go down in Movietown annals as the year of wrecked marriages, with more than a dozen casualties counted among the stars.

Most spectacular rift was the Debbie Reynolds - Eddie Fisher parting.

But there were other crackups—Cary Grant and Betsy Drake, Marlon Brando and Anna Kashfi, Rock and Phyllis Hudson, Esther Williams and Ben Gage, Jack and Rhoda Borgnine.

Also kicking over the traces are Guy and Sheila Madison, Rhonda Fleming and Dr. Lew Morril, Peggy Lee and Dewey Martin, Pier Angeli and Vic Damone, and Sammy Davis Jr. and Loray White.

A few others are tottering on the brink.

Latest to hit the skids are John Barrymore Jr. and red-haired Cara Williams. Married six years, the youthful pair called it quits this month.

Most star shy away from discussing their marital explosions, but Cara has a theory about Hollywood marriages and why they don't work. She's a close friend of Anna Kashfi and Debbie Reynolds and attributes their marriage failures to the same element that destroyed her happiness with young Barrymore.

"An actor should never marry an actress," Cara said. "It's as simple as that. I know I'll never marry anyone in show business again."

"The insecurities of being a performer are difficult enough with just one member of the family involved. But when both of them are worrying about where their next picture is coming from it is impossible."

"When things go wrong the couple begins to take it out on one another."

"If a wife is working and her husband isn't, the arguments start. Basically you both know what's at the bottom of the trouble, but you never mention it. You're afraid to."

"It's even worse if the actor is a big star but the wife isn't getting many parts. Pretty soon she starts nagging her husband for roles too."

"Even if they're both successful they never know when or where the next picture is coming from. It amounts to an on-and-off life of unemployment. If you're not busy in this town the word gets around. Jobs become hard to find."

Cara says she didn't care about a career while she was married to Barrymore. But now that she's on her own, the shapely actress is booming for activity. She's given a chance for an Oscar this year for her performance in "The Defiant Ones," and currently is negotiating for a Broadway play.

"John and I never worked together," she said. "I always believed he could do better by himself."

"Our marriage had too many insecurities based on his career. The same is true of Debbie and Anna and their marriages. There has to be some security in a marriage, or else it doesn't work."

"Darned few Hollywood marriages between performers have lasted over the years. That's why I'll never make the same mistake again."

## Tokyo Woman Turns Tiger

**TOKYO (AP)**—Mrs. Toshiko Kobayashi unsheathed an antique samurai sword Tuesday night, chased three burglars away from her home and scared two others so badly they waited for her to come back and capture them.

The five masked men broke into the woman's home and tied up her two sons. But the burglars relaxed their guard. She dashed into her room, took the long, curved blade — a family treasure — and told the intruders:

"Now, gentlemen, I am warranted to slay you in self-defense."

Two of the men dropped to their knees and the others fled, with Mrs. Kobayashi in hot but fruitless pursuit. The frightened pair were still on their knees when she returned with the police.

## Mine Death Toll Listed

**SPRINGHILL, N.S. (AP)** — The death toll in the Cumberland No. 2 mine disaster was placed at 74 Tuesday night, the highest in Canadian mining since the 1920s.

Hope finally was abandoned for nine men still missing in the deep coal shaft where an underground upheaval Oct. 23 trapped 174 miners. A hundred men were rescued, some of them after being trapped for days.

Four more bodies were recovered Tuesday night. Searchers continued their slow hunt through the rock and rubble for the other nine bodies. Less than 100 feet of the mine remained to be explored.

A fund being raised to help the relatives of those killed neared \$600,000. Officials hoped a million dollars would be collected.
