

Holmes Says Tax Revolt Led To Election Loss

SALEM (AP)—A revolt against Oregon's tax picture led to his defeat in Tuesday's election, Gov. Robert Holmes said Wednesday night.

"There is no question in my mind but that it was a vote against the tax picture and tax cost," said Holmes, beaten by Republican Mark Hatfield by 60,000 votes.

"Throughout the campaign it was Mr. Hatfield's suggestion that he and the Republicans were going to save money."

"They led people to believe that there will be smaller taxes. This was what it was," said Holmes.

Holmes said taxes also led to his loss of heavily Democratic Multnomah County, where prop-

erty assessments recently were boosted by a Democratic assessor.

"Many people were unhappy about the property tax situation, and a good many of them blamed the governor," said Holmes.

"I'm not going to predict what the Republicans can do," he said. But then Holmes added:

"I said in the campaign, however, that the only way to effect tax cuts is to cut back important services. And I don't think the people will want those services cut back."

The governor said he has made no plans about what he will do when he leaves office in January.

"There are a good many things that need to be done in the governor's office in the next couple of months that I'll be here," Holmes said.

Device In New Moon Rocket To Amend Track Deviation

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Air Force's new moon rocket—which may go aloft early Friday—will be equipped with a device designed to correct any deviation from its planned trajectory.

Such a deviation was a key factor in keeping the last moon rocket, fired Oct. 11, from reaching the vicinity of the moon.

But even with the new device, chances of success in the coming moonshot are put at no better than 1 in 25.

The new wrinkle is a special modification of the moon rocket's radio system. Its function is to encourage more speed if the rocket deviates from its planned trajectory in the early stages of flight.

In the Oct. 11 shot, the rocket began its trajectory 3 1/2 degrees higher than intended. The result was it had a tougher fight with the earth's gravitational pull. Its ultimate speed thus fell some 500 miles an hour short of what it needed to reach the vicinity of the moon, some 222,000 miles away.

The new corrective device will ride in the second of the four stages of the rocket. If there is an error in trajectory pitch, its job would be to automatically delay the cutting off of the second stage's engine.

The system wouldn't be expected to change the course of the rocket. But the hope would be that the added speed would enable it to zoom its instrumented payload to a point in space where the gravity of the moon might take off.

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Man Killed By Tragedy

Garner died en route to a hospital.

Police said the driver of the car, Howard C. Schallan, 37, Portland, told them he did not see Tannahill until moments before the impact.

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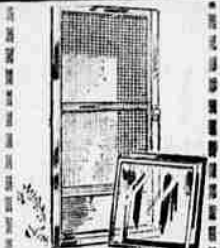
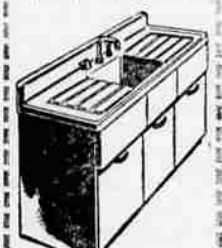
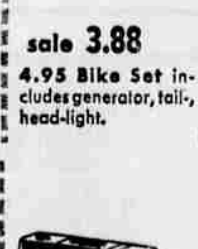
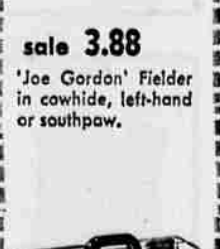
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
