Two directors of the Klamath-Lake National Farm Loan Association will attend the annual four-state conference of NFILA representatives in Spokane on November 11 and 12.

Police Locate Stolen Car Near Site Of Tool Theft

A California car stolen from a downtown Klamath Falls street was recovered near Dorris Tuesday—some 12 hours after its loss was reported.

Nearby, officers found a Southern Pacific tamper box which had been broken into. An amazing amount of tools was missing.

The two locations were some half-mile apart.

John W. Winsell of Redding said he had left his 1952 car near the Pelican Theater at 9:30 p.m. Monday to find a place to eat. At midnight he told police the car was missing.

A police network teletype message arrived in city police headquarters at 4:45 p.m. Tuesday saying the car had been recovered near Dorris. All four wheels and hubcaps were missing, the message said, and the car had been thoroughly ransacked.

Additionally, Southern Pacific Officer Bill Warren said the railroad tamper box half a mile away had been entered by breaking a lock. Missing were enough tools to open a car repair shop. The loot included:

Two hand grease guns, four crescent wrenches, a set of sockets, a set of end wrenches, three monkey wrenches, a set of Allen wrenches, two screw drivers, three box wrenches, a lead hammer and a pair of chrome pliers.

Officers said the persons who drove the car into California must have been well acquainted with the territory to avoid the California checking station.

Also reported to city police: Lester Stevens, a downtown hotel resident, said he was strongarmed in the rest room of a local tavern at 6 p.m. Tuesday. He said four men accosted him, robbed him of his wrist watch and four dollars, and punched him in the jaw.

Four hours later police arrested two brothers in a downtown tavern in connection with the robbery. Winfield Chiloquin, 32, Chiloquin, was charged with strongarm robbery and Melvin Lee Chiloquin, 28, Chiloquin, was arrested for vagrancy.
