Bly Timber Firm Bid Successful

LAKEVIEW — The Bly Lumber Company was the successful bidder at an oral auction sale held in the office of the Fremont National Forest at 2 p.m. October 31 for 225 M board feet of live ponderosa pine.

The timber sold at the appraised price of \$20 per M for the green timber and \$10 per M for the blue stained timber. The timber is in the Pothold area of the Bly Ranger District.

The primary purpose of the sale was to bring about the removal of the trees that are infested with broods of the western pine beetle. These broods of beetles will emerge next May and re-infest additional timber. The trees can be identified in late August and September by slight fading in color of the needles.

Bly Lumber Company was represented by Don McGee of Bly. The timber will be logged by Leonard Putnam.

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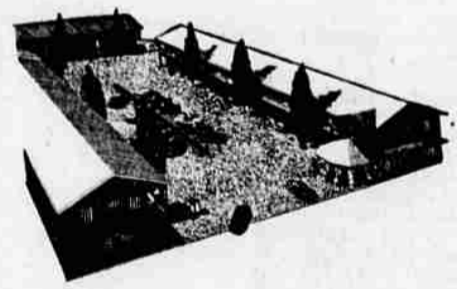
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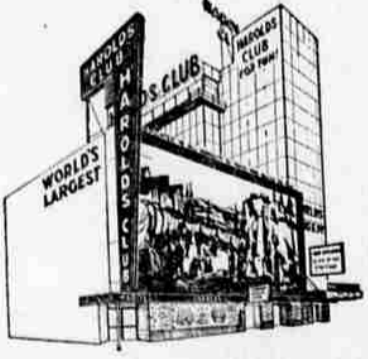
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
