## No Sure Bets Found In Pro Grid Clashes

NEW YORK (UPI) — It is utterly impossible to make a sound "betting line" in pro football, Baltimore Colts General Manager Lon Kellert said today in explaining the weekly wave of "upsets."

Kellert, quite naturally, won't talk points or betting. To pro football men this would be akin to J. Edgar Hoover praising John D. Linger.

But he will talk, and at length, on why some teams which are rated underdogs come along and bounce the supposed favorites on their collective ears.

Maybe you have wondered why, for instance, the New York Giants were 10 point underdogs against the mighty Cleveland Browns and three point underdogs against the Colts on successive weekends—and won both games. Or why in 19 of the 42 pro games to date the underdog has risen up to flatten the favorite.

There are, to quote the former all-around Penn athlete, no less than five reasons. As he sees it:

1. All the teams actually are very evenly matched.
2. No team is anywhere near 10 points better than another.
3. One mistake can turn the whole tide in such cases.
4. An injury to a key man alters the whole setup.
5. No team can stay mentally

As example, he points to the Colt situation in Baltimore.

"The closest colleges are Navy, at Annapolis, and the University of Maryland, right outside of Washington," he explained. "So in Baltimore it's 'our Colts' and the ball club reacts to this attitude. They get a real lift out of a home crowd and naturally play better."

The slightest letdown is enough to spell the difference between victory and defeat, Kellert analyzed.

"Look at our team last season," he pointed out. "We lost three games in a total of less than three minutes. Detroit beat us in the last 48 seconds; Green Bay defeated us with 29 seconds to play; and San Francisco beat us with 46 seconds to play."

# Just One PCC Loss

## California Leads In Race To Bowl Of Roses

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — It may become hopelessly muddled later, but at the moment the Pacific Coast Conference picture shows California clearly leading the race to the Rose Bowl.

The Bears, with a 4-1 mark, are the only PCC football squad having just one conference loss. Three other schools each have two defeats but they have an outside chance to snatch the rosebuds.

California is definitely the favorite, despite the reluctance of Bear coach Pete Elliott to accept the role. He's worried about this Saturday's contest with Washington.

Washington meets the Bears in Seattle, but California is favored. If Cal goes according to form and tops the Huskies, it looks as if the Bears will meet Iowa in Pasadena New Year's Day.

After Washington, Cal takes on Stanford in the season closer, the traditional big game that can go either way, and often does. The Bears, however, undoubtedly will be the favorite.

California's three challengers, Washington State, Oregon State and Southern California, have rough going to overtake the Bears. WSC, with a 5-2 record, has one

conference game left. The Cougars meet arch-rival Washington on neutral ground to end their PCC season. Should they win as expected and Cal lose one or both its closers, the Cougars will have a shot at the roses.

Oregon State, 4-2, must face Stanford at Palo Alto and Oregon at Oregon's home in Corvallis. State should be favored in both contests, although odds mean little in an OSC-Oregon battle.

A Cal loss to either Washington or Stanford or both, combined with two Oregon State victories, would also give the Beavers a

chance for the PCC crown.

Southern Cal has just one PCC game left, its traditional go-round with cross-town UCLA. USC should be favored, but still anything can go.

The Trojans will pack a 4-2 PCC mark into the UCLA game and one or two California losses plus an SC victory can give Troy a chance to see Pasadena.

Oregon at 3-3 is a very dark horse that would have to win both its remaining games, against UCLA and Oregon State, to get a shot—providing of course that Cal lost one or two games. Both possibilities are unlikely.

Stanford, 2-3; Washington 1-4; UCLA, 1-4; and Idaho, 0-3; can only play the role of spoilers.

To put the PCC race in a nutshell: If Cal wins its remaining two games the Bears are in, no matter what happens.

But should Cal lose one and its three top challengers win all their remaining games, the race will be a four-way tie. Then it will be up to a vote of the conference fathers to pick a winner.

If anything else happens? Figure that on your sliderule.

## Coaches Warn Bears Huskies Rugged Club

California's Golden Bears better leave their Rose Bowl colored glasses at home this weekend when they play the Washington Huskies in Seattle.

That's the advice of Coaches Bill Barnes of UCLA and Don Clark of Southern California.

"I think Washington can beat California," said Barnes.

"If Washington is right, it can

whip any team in the conference," Clark added. Both men spoke at a Los Angeles football writers meeting Monday.

Barnes, whose Bruins dropped a 20-17 game to California last week, had an afterthought: Cal's Joe Kapp might give the Huskies a hard time. "He's awfully hard to contain," said Barnes.

Pete Elliott's Bears, leading the conference with a 4-1 record, have a good chance to meet Iowa in the Rose Bowl on New Year's Day. Washington and Stanford must be reckoned with first.

## Juniata Eyes Perfect Grid Season Mark

HUNTINGDON, Pa. (AP) — Juniata College, where the good little football player gets his chance, is heading for its fifth undefeated season in six years.

The small-package combination of gridiron talent and will-to-win has added up to only one loss in six seasons.

Juniata's current squad under Coach Ken Bunn, winds up its 1958 campaign Saturday against Albright. A victory against the Lions would give Juniata's Indians an unbeaten season.

## Grid Coach On Pan, Alums Want Winners

Some college football coaches are beginning to sweat a bit from the heat of burned up alumni who can't understand why their teams can't win consistently, or even at all.

Some other coaches, because they just inherited teams with dubious talent, are serving a year's grace, but are marked men if they don't produce a winner next season.

The Big Ten is having the greatest share of coaching headaches. The time honored symbol of a coach being hung in effigy by students is becoming so common-place one begins to wonder if it might not be the outcome of a post fraternity party rank rather than the honest-to-goodness ire of football-crazy students.

Michigan State's Duffy Daugherty is the latest to see his image hanging from a tree. It happened last Saturday night after MSU was upset by Indiana 6-0. The Spartans have a 2-4-1 record, but were picked to finish fourth in the pre-season poll by The Associated Press of sportswriters and broadcasters.

Take the case of Ohio State's Woody Hayes. His Bucks, picked in the preseason poll as the national champion, have a 4-1-2 mark. But they have lost one and tied a pair in their last three outings. They lost the Big Ten crown to Iowa last week, though they don't face the Hawks until this Saturday.
