**Baker-La Grande area**—Considerable cloudiness through Thursday with showers; locally gusty winds. Highs 45-50; low tonight 32-37.

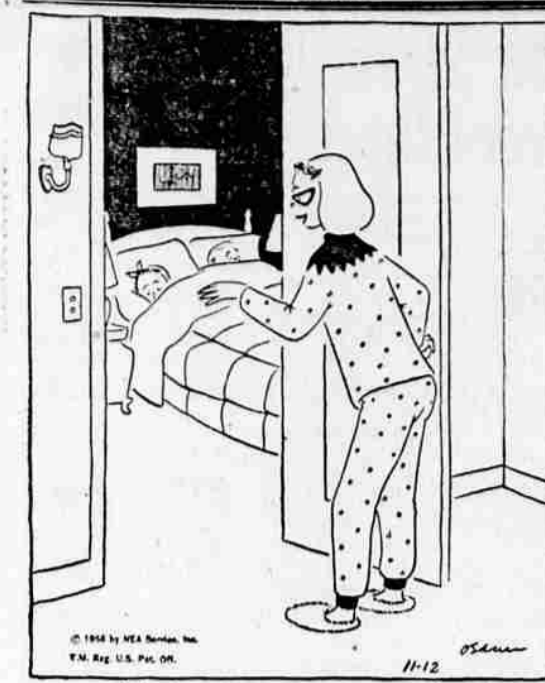
**LOSE THE KEY**

## Demo Asked To Discuss Woes With Mexico Chief

WASHINGTON — The Eisenhower administration has called on Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson (D-Tex) for another bipartisan task—discussion of continental problems with the incoming president of Mexico.

Johnson, the Senate's Democratic leader, is expected to go to Mexico City some time this month to confer personally with President-elect Adolfo Lopez Mateos.

In Congress and the State Department the invitation to Johnson to undertake the personal diplomatic mission to Mexico was regarded as an indication the administration wants to work closely with the party leader in shoring up Latin American relations.

It was the second bipartisan assignment Johnson has been asked to undertake this week. Previously Secretary of State Dulles had announced Johnson had agreed to speak in the United Nations in behalf of the American resolution for the peaceful uses of outer space.

Although Johnson heads the opposition party in the Senate, he has worked closely with the Republican administration at times, especially on problems involving foreign policy. He said in a speech last week the increased Democratic majorities in the new Congress will meet President Eisenhower at least half way.

Johnson is generally expected to retain his post as Democratic leader when the Senate meets in January. Sen. William Proxmire (D-Wis), one of an increased number of liberal Democrats in the new Senate, said yesterday he has found no indications of dissatisfaction with Johnson's course.

One senator-elect reported Tuesday he understood Johnson had called the 13 Democrats newly elected to the Senate to meet with him at his Texas ranch next month.

Johnson, in a telephone interview, discounted talk of a pre-session meeting and said he had issued no blanket invitation for one.

But Senator-elect Frank E. Moss of Utah said later he had tentatively agreed to meet with Johnson Dec. 5, and not the impression in talking with Johnson that at least all the new Western Democratic senators would attend.

Johnson's visit to Mexico City is expected to precede Lopez Mateos' inaugural on Dec. 1. He will be representing not only the State Department but the top-heavy majority of Democrats in the Senate which expects to begin an early inquiry into Latin American relations.

Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore) has been designated chairman of a Senate Foreign Relations subcommittee which may begin hearings in January.

Johnson called last week for a review of American foreign policy "so that bold, new, imaginative programs can be recommended to responsible officials."
