San Francisco Bay Area: Fair today; increasing cloudiness tonight; occasional rain likely Friday; slightly cooler Friday; high today in San Francisco 65, Oakland 68, San Mateo and San Rafael 67; low tonight 48-54; gentle winds becoming southwesterly 10-20 m.p.h. Friday.

Northern and Central California: Occasional rain in the extreme northern portion today spreading slowly southward to the vicinity of Monterey and Stockton by late Friday; otherwise mostly fair through Friday except for coastal cloudiness; cooler in the Northern portion Friday; coastal winds south and southwest 12-25 m.p.h. Point Arena northward today and tonight and Monterey northward Friday; otherwise west or northwesterly winds 10-20 m.p.h.

Mt. Shasta-Siskiyou area: Occasional rain today, tonight and Friday, except snow above 6,000 feet today and above 4,000 feet Friday. Cooler Friday.

Sierra Nevada: Increasing cloudiness tonight with a chance of rain in the extreme northern ranges late tonight; occasional rain at low levels spreading southward to Yosemite by late Friday; cooler in the northern ranges Friday.

Sacramento Valley: Fair today but considerable high cloudiness in the northern portion; increasing cloudiness tonight with occasional rain likely late tonight near Red Bluff, spreading slowly southward to Sacramento by late Friday; cooler Friday; high today 63-68; low tonight 47-53; high Friday 57-64; southerly winds 8-18 m.p.h.

Northwestern California: Occasional rain extreme northern portion today spreading slowly southward to most of the area by midday Friday; slightly cooler; high today and low tonight Napa 67-47, Ukiah 66-46 and Santa Rosa 68-48. Coastal winds south or southwest 12-25 m.p.h. Cape Mendocino northward and westerly 10-20 m.p.h. elsewhere today, becoming southerly 12-25 m.p.h. Friday.
