Work Finished On Huge Dam

COUGAR, Wash. (AP)—The Swift Dam, one of the world's largest, was finished Monday, and late in the winter will begin producing power.

The dam, in the higher foothills of the Cascade Mountains, has an installed power capacity of 250,000 kilowatts. Production will begin when a 12-mile-long lake behind the dam reaches an operating level. Pacific Power and Light Co. said its dam is the 10th largest in sheer bulk of all dams in the world. It is 512 feet high, and its base is one-third of a mile through.

The dam is on the Lewis River in southwestern Washington, and is about 50 air miles northeast of Portland, Ore.

POLAND GETS VACCINE
WARSAW (UPI)—Officials prepared Saturday to distribute a \$300,000 shipment of anti-polio vaccine from the United States. The vaccine, which arrived by plane Friday, was the second shipment since October. The vaccine was purchased by Poland with American aid funds.

National Grange Proposes Farmers Choose Aid Slate

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. (AP)—The National Grange proposed today that producers of each farm commodity be allowed to choose through referendum the type of farm-aid program they deem best suited to the commodity.

The farm organization has suggested in convention resolutions that such programs be managed by organized producers, under guidance of the government.

The Grange declared that agriculture faces the prospect of overproduction for years to come, hence, it said, effective ways

must be found to adjust production to markets or else farmers will suffer economically.

"We reaffirm the Grange position favoring self-help programs developed along commodity-by-commodity lines. Therein lies the power to manage our production and our marketing in such a manner as to provide consumers with an abundance without overabundance at prices reasonable to both producers and consumers," the resolution said.

This Grange approach to the farm problem has not found favor

with Eisenhower administration farm officials.

"We believe," the Grange said, "that the control of farm programs should be primarily in the hands of farmers. It is our belief that the cost of these programs should be born by producers to the extent that the benefits accrue to them. We deny that such

management impairs essential freedom.

The farm organization called upon the states to help halt a trend toward a strong federal government by assuming their full financial and other responsibilities.

Along this same line, the convention said the U.S. Supreme

Court has been making decisions which "appear to invade the prerogatives of states (and) which are generally considered as usurping the field of the legislative branch of government."

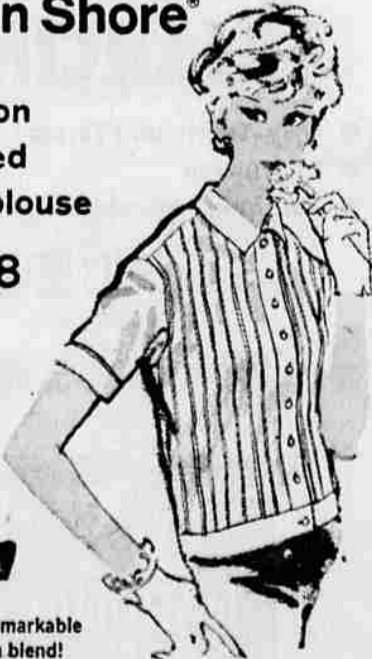
