Mrs. L. Low Is 95 Today

Mrs. Lena Lavenberg Low, a resident of Klamath County since 1886, is celebrating her 95th birthday today at the home of her daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. John Siemens, 1112 Eldorado.

Mrs. Low is a native of Oregon, born at Phoenix in the Rogue River Valley. She became the wife of a Klamath County sheriff, Charles C. Low and mother of a Klamath County sheriff, Lloyd L. Low, still living in Klamath Falls.

The Low home in those early days was a mecca for travelers. Her husband hauled the first load of errant Modoc Indians from the Lava Beds to banishment in Oklahoma while his young wife stayed alone at home near the present town of Keno.

She is the mother of four children, two daughters, Mrs. Siemens, Klamath Falls, Mrs. Hugh Worcester, Berkeley; Lloyd L. Low, Klamath Falls, and Judd Low of Roseburg; four grandchildren, Johanne Ray, this city, Beverly Sinclair, Seaside, California, Jack Siemens, Klamath Agency, and Charles Low, serving in the Navy. Great-grandchildren are Rebecca and Lucinda Ray, Robert, Randy, Meredith and Richard Sinclair, Seaside.

Orders Given To Minute Men

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—The nation's aerial minute men are getting their orders now — for use in event of sudden global war.

Brig. Gen. Felix Vidal, deputy assistant chief of the Air Force Reserve, said Monday mobilization orders are being mailed to 53,000 of the best-trained reserve airmen.

"The orders are effective upon a mobilization proclamation," he said. "The orders tell the reservist to report immediately, and where. They authorize transportation. They name his unit and — practically — his job."

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Auto heir Horace Dodge II's wife screamed "That's outrageous — and you know it!" during her trial on a drunk charge.

Mrs. Gregg Sherwood Dodge sat quietly when police officer Lawrence Brown told Municipal Court her speech was slurred and profane when she was arrested Aug. 26.

But when he said her evening gown was mussed and a shoulder strap was disarranged, the blonde actress shouted angry denial. When the judge told her to be quiet, she said: "Well, he is lying."

Chicago newspaper columnist Irving Kuncinet was with Mrs. Dodge at the time of the arrest. He awaits trial Dec. 10 on a charge of driving while under the influence of liquor.

ACTOR'S AGENT SUED FOR DIVORCE
SANTA MONICA, Calif. (AP)—Katharine (Ketti) Frings, Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright, has sued actor's agent Kurt Frings for divorce.

She charges mental cruelty and asks custody of their two children, Kathie, 7, and Peter, 6. The couple's 20-year-marriage ended Oct. 31.

Mrs. Frings, also a screen writer, won the 1933 Pulitzer Prize for play writing with her adaptation of Thomas Wolfe's novel "Look Homeward, Angel."

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Scientists At Lockheed View Battery Development

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Energy produced by electrochemical reaction is measured in watt hours per pound of total weight. An automobile battery yields 8 to 10 watt-hours per pound.

Root said that a fuel cell is presently being developed which is designed to produce 100 watt-hours per pound. He predicted that one of 300 watt-hours could be constructed within five years.

Comparing the cell to a standard battery, Root explained that the basic difference is that in the cell, the active chemicals are stored outside so that "components of the cell are not consumed in the electrode reaction."

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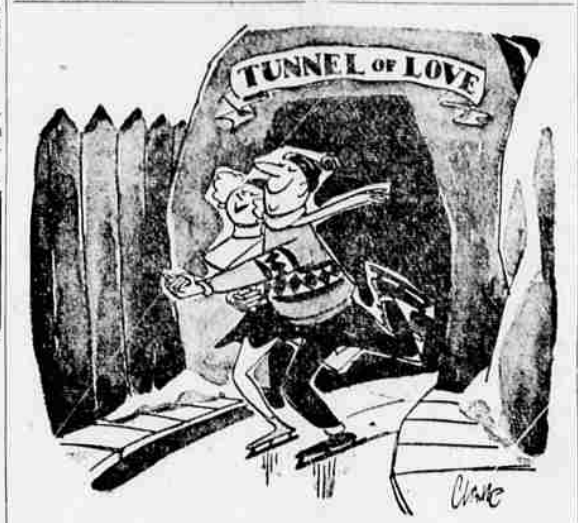
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
