**Union, Management Unite To Revive Fur Industry**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Union and management forces in the fur industry united today in a three-year, \$900,000 program to revive the American woman's flagging interest in buying furs.

While mink, ermine and sable remain popular with those who can afford them, the less exotic furs have slumped in feminine favor. Fur sales have dwindled to about half the volume of 10 years ago.

Probably, it was the Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butcher Workmen's Union which took the initiative in trying to restore the glamor appeal of fur coats.

The Fur Workers Union has been adopted by the Meat Cutters as its fur and leather department, but a substantial part of the department's membership is out of work.

The Meat Cutters announced that an initial \$25,000 contribution from their treasury will be supplemented with about \$150,000 a year collected by a joint union-management authority for use of the union label in fur garments.

Another \$150,000 annually, more or less, is to be raised by individual contributions from the many fur manufacturers — mostly small operators — and from the manufacturers' trade associations.

A study of consumers' fur-buying habits, wants, likes and dislikes has been made, the union announced. That study will provide the basis for a promotion and advertising campaign.

This program will be managed by a Fur Fashion and Information Council headed by Abe Feinglass, director of the union's fur and leather department.

In addition, Feinglass said, the council will undertake an intensive research program into fur coloring, styling and production techniques.

The fur industry acknowledges makers of cloth coats have cut deeply into their market by smart styling, the use of new fabrics, textures and finishes, and introduction of new artificial fibers.

**Galaxy Photog Has Rough Time**

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — Photographing a star galaxy during a snowstorm turned out badly for Swiss-born scientist Fritz Zwicky, 59.

Dr. Zwicky, professor of astrophysics at the California Institute of Technology, became ill as a result of overexposure to the cold. He spent 4 1/2 hours in a small cage atop mile-high Mt. Palomar taking spectrograph pictures of the galaxy with the aid of the 200-inch telescope. When he finished at 3 a.m. Monday, he was half numb. To make matters worse, his pictures were blurred and of no use.

**Hot Water Well On Farm Dumbfounds Farmer**

MONMOUTH, Ill. (AP)—Farmer Chalmers Lovdahl has a hot well on his farm and he's in a little fever about it.

The 30-foot well, Lovdahl said, had furnished sparkling and cold water for his household for 36 years until last August.

"The water was far colder and better for drinking than water from a nearby well—125 feet deep—that I use for my stock," Lovdahl said.

But the water in the smaller well began warming up last August. It became progressively warmer and recently it leveled off at 101 degrees, where it has remained.

Lovdahl called in experts from the University of Illinois and the State Health Department to explain the phenomenon. No satisfactory explanations were given.

Lovdahl said he's undecided whether to move away on the theory he is living on top of an incipient volcano or to harness the water to his hot water heating system and forget about fuel bills.

Russell Lane, a state water survey chemist who inspected the well, said he'd never seen anything like it. University geologists said the same. A water softener service man from Madison, Wis., came, shook his head, and went away.

Lane had a theory but he was the first to admit it might be all wet. Maybe, he said, a vein of coal beneath the well has caught fire, radiating heat toward the surface.

But he sprayed his own theory with cold water; there has been no change in the temperature of the water from the deep well, 120 feet away.

"No one can tell me anything," Lovdahl lamented.

**Crooner Sells Ranch In Elko**

ELKO, Nev. (AP) — Crooner Bing Crosby has pulled out of the Nevada ranching business.

Crosby sold his 19,000-acre ranch north of here, its 3,700 head of cattle and all equipment for a price exceeding one million dollars, it was announced Tuesday.

The buyers are California ranchers and businessmen Edward Johnson, Earl Pressnell and William Johnson.
