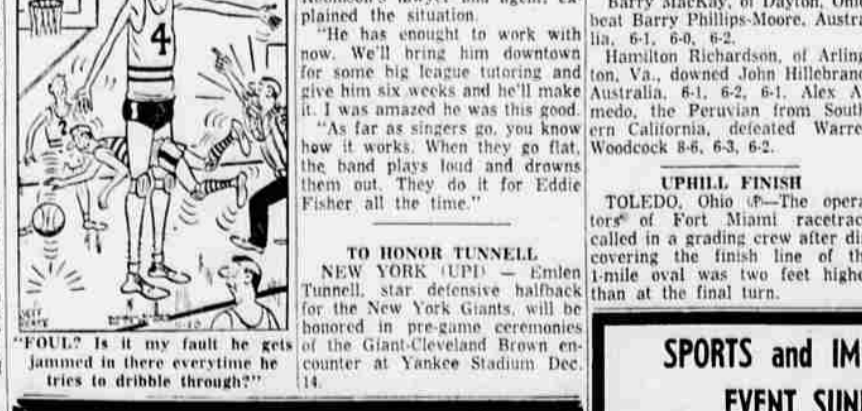
Del Flanagan Beats Turner, Seeking Akins
