**Gilchrist High News**

James E. Sowder, leader of the Deschutes Research Center, led the juniors and seniors of Gilchrist on a field trip to the Pringle Falls Experimental Forest 35 miles south of Bend last week. The visit came as a climax to the

study of conservation being made by the class, giving them an excellent opportunity to see the scientist's contribution to conservation.

The purpose of the experimental forest is to provide practical knowledge, through research, to public and private interests to aid in the management of timber and land resources.

Some of the research projects being carried on in the 36,455-acre forest are methods of cutting ponderosa pine to increase the number of board feet per acre, several thinning studies in ponderosa increased growth of trees after brush removal, spread of infection by pine dwarf, mistletoe, lodgepole thinning and influence of grazing on ground cover and reproduction.

The students visited the Genetics Arboretum where a hybrid pine test was begun in 1953. The hybrid being tested is a cross of two types of ponderosa pine, the hardy Rocky Mountain (scopulorum) variety, with the fast-growing Jeffrey from the Eldorado area of California. Also in the plot are the parents of the hybrid. Plans are to expand the area for studies of other promising hybrids.

Disease is not yet a problem at Pringle Falls. The most common ones are the pine dwarf mistletoe, needle blights, rusts and scales. The Pringle Falls Forest receives visitors from all parts of the world. Recent ones have been from Turkey, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Thailand, Russia and Germany. There has been an increase in the exchange of scientific information with Russia in the last five years, Sowder said, but little collaboration is foreseeable with Russia's foresters, because the two countries differ in forestry goals.

Today the field of forestry research is unlimited. An M. S. degree is becoming one of the basic requirements for research work, with one degree in forestry. Other degrees may be in ecology, entomology, silviculture, or others in the field of natural science. Many types of occupations such as chemistry, mathematics, physics, writing, forestry, and statistics contribute their knowledge to the work of forestry research.
