Convict, Due For Parole, Would Like Printing Job

SALEM Ore. (AP)—Thirty-one years of waiting inside the state prison appeared nearly over for the slight man with the lined, leathery face.

When told that a parole had come at last, Hugh D'Autremont murmured: "It's hard to realize it's true."

Some others found it hard to believe, too. They said the parole was a mistake.

For, after all these years, feeling still ran high about the crime that sent D'Autremont to prison. That was the attempted robbery of a mail train near Ashland in 1923. Three trainmen were shot and killed and a fourth was blown up by dynamite.

The gunmen fled empty handed, Hugh later was arrested while serving in the Army in the Philippines. He was convicted of murder. His twin brothers, Roy and Ray, pleaded guilty.

The news of his parole was given to Hugh in the prison by an Associated Press reporter. Hugh appeared stunned at first.

Then he said: "That's good. I'm glad to hear about it."

D'Autremont, now 54, said he had expected a parole eventually, but he added:

"It's hard to realize it's true. I don't feel much reaction now, but it will begin to percolate into my head after awhile."

"I hope to get a job as a linotype operator, and it doesn't make much difference where I live."

Jail Escapee Gets 4 Years LA GRANDE (AP) - A man captured Saturday 24 hours after escaping from the Union County Jail was sentenced here Monday to four years in the Oregon state prison.

He was Paul R. Brown, 22. The sentence was for the burglary Oct. 31 of a Union, Ore., tavern. George Anderson Jr., the district attorney, said no charge was filed for the jailbreak because that is only a misdemeanor under Oregon law.

Brown, at a Nov. 6 hearing, pleaded guilty to burglary. When he broke out of jail he was awaiting pre-sentence investigation.
