Weather Bill Will Be Cold

The Thanksgiving weather menu featured the season's coldest weather, garnished with brisk winds and topped with white snow flakes.

The traditional holiday turkey dinner was much more appetizing than the offerings off the climatic tray.

Only the ocean-warmed coastal sections escaped the late November cold snap as the mountain of arctic air spread across the country. The stiff winds added to the discomfort of the frosty air.

Most of the northern two thirds of the nation was below freezing. It was colder in Montana, parts of Colorado, the Dakotas, Minnesota and Wisconsin where temperatures dropped to below zero in many areas.

Lowest readings of the season were reported in much of the Midwest. They were near zero in Illinois and a hard freeze was reported south of the Ohio Valley into Missouri and Kentucky. Low marks included — 13 at Grand Forks, N. D., and — 12 at International Falls, Minn.

One incident marred the day's visit to Livermore. Police Sgt. Robert Sullivan, who acted as her chauffeur, dropped unconscious beside the limousine he was driving. He was later brought to a hospital in San Francisco, where his condition was reported as pretty good. It was believed he suffered an attack of acute ulcers.

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Foreign Aid Budget Hiked Despite Cut Spending Drive

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Eisenhower administration has tentatively added about a billion dollars to its new foreign aid budget despite a White House drive to cut federal spending.

Government agencies have put together a package calling for about \$4,200,000,000 to \$4,300,000,000 in economic, technical and military aid to more than 40 friendly governments in the year starting next July 1.

Congress this year voted about \$3,300,000,000 in foreign aid funds after cutting 600 millions from the amount requested.

The higher figure proposed for next year is still subject to change.

Responsible informants who reported the higher figure said President Eisenhower and Secretary of State Dulles consider a vigorous foreign aid program particularly important at this time to offset Soviet moves in this field.

The proposed spending would cut down military aid and give added emphasis to economic and technical aid.

Price Specialist Blasts Costs

CORVALLIS (AP) — Increased marketing costs caused most of the retail food price increase since 1947, Mrs. Elvera Horrell, an Oregon State College price specialist, said Wednesday.

Mrs. Horrell said since 1947 marketing costs doubled, but the retail bill for farm-produced food increased only 38 per cent.

She said the percentage of the pay check spent for food has not changed since pre-World War II days, although most food costs have increased.

Singer Sued By Stand-In

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Pearl Bailey's former movie stand-in has sued the singer for \$50,000 damages, alleging slander.

May Johnson's complaint says that last Nov. 13, at the Samuel Goldwyn Studios, in the presence of dozens of persons working in "Porgy and Bess," Miss Bailey demanded that Miss Johnson be fired. The suit says Miss Bailey accused Miss Johnson of dishonest dealings.

Bystanders included production manager Doc Merriman and producer Otto Preminger, who thereupon dismissed Miss Johnson from further work, the complaint asserts.

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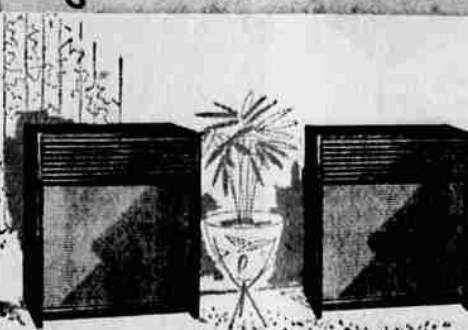
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
