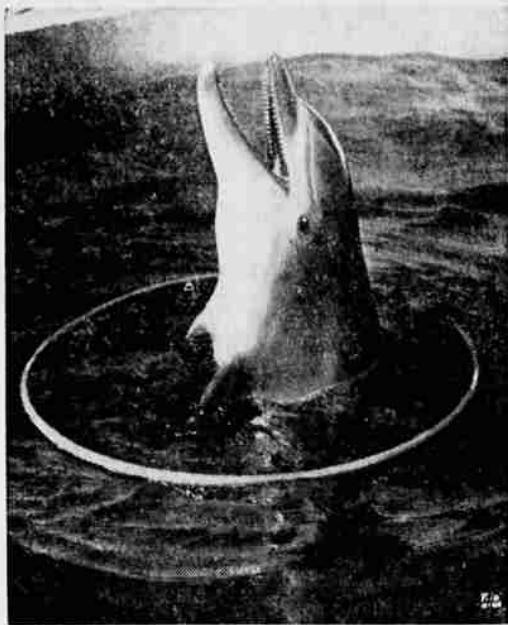

ENVOY — Richard F. Wigglesworth, 67, retiring Republican member of the House from Massachusetts, has been named by the President as ambassador to Canada.



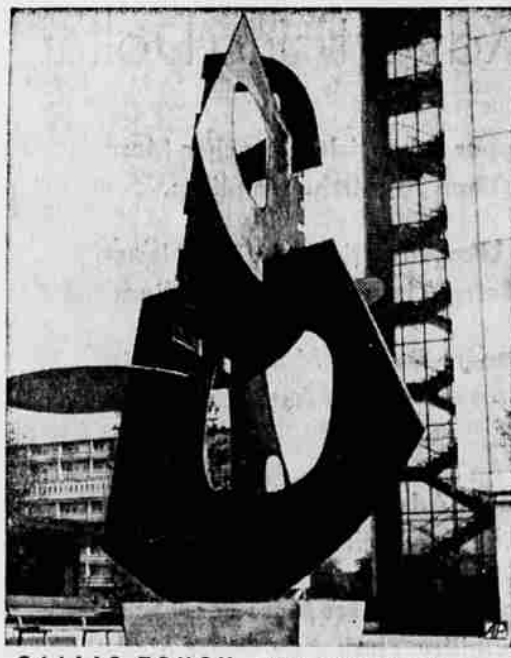
