Another holiday guest was Mrs. J. W. Pixley who came from Eugene to be with her daughter, Lois Serruys.



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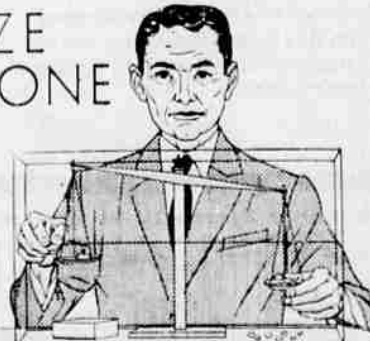
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
