The variety of "double duty" yuletide greetings—cards that wish a Merry Christmas and also present the youngster with a toy or game — is greater than ever this year, a Hallmark spokesman reported. What little girl wouldn't get a kick from the card that opens to reveal a supply of decorated note paper, complete with envelopes? Or the greeting that is a queen-sized paper doll, with three wardrobes? Other holiday wishes for the youngster set include a card that can be transformed into a series of colorful tree ornaments, and one that tells Clement C. Moore's immortal story, "A Visit from St. Nicholas," in pop-up scenes. Still other greetings, designed especially for an infant's first Christmas, provide a book in which the child's reactions to the event can be recorded.
