Yreka C Of C Committee Delays Secession Vote

YREKA—Voting will be delayed on the secession of the Yreka High School attendance area from the Siskiyou Union High School district until financing is assured to complete the high school building program, including additions to the new Yreka High School building. Last week a vote by the chamber of commerce committee was in favor of not completing the filing of a petition for a withdrawal election until after a sale of \$318,000 in district bonds and final approval of state funds to complete the building program.

Bonus For Vets Deadline Nears

War veterans who entered military service from Minnesota, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Louisiana were warned today of approaching deadlines for applying for their state bonuses. George E. 21 Feared Dead In Plane Crash

MADRID, Spain (AP)—A Spanish airliner with 21 persons aboard was believed to have crashed Thursday night on a flight to Madrid from Vigo, in northwest Spain. The four-engine Languedoc left Vigo at 4:45 p.m. with 16 passengers and five crew members and was due here at 6:30 p.m. It carried fuel to last only until 9:30 p.m. The last report from the plane said it was having trouble with its communication system.

Shoot Victim Enters Jail

Paul Hawk, 21-year-old Klamath Falls man shot by a city police officer when fleeing from a car Thanksgiving morning, was transferred from Klamath Valley Hospital to the county jail Thursday. Hawk was hospitalized with a bullet wound in his abdomen immediately after being shot at the climax of a brisk chase by Patrolman John Kennard. He had made steady recovery since his hospital admission. The victim is charged with taking and using an automobile without consent of the owner, John Kinna, 3850 Clinton Avenue.
