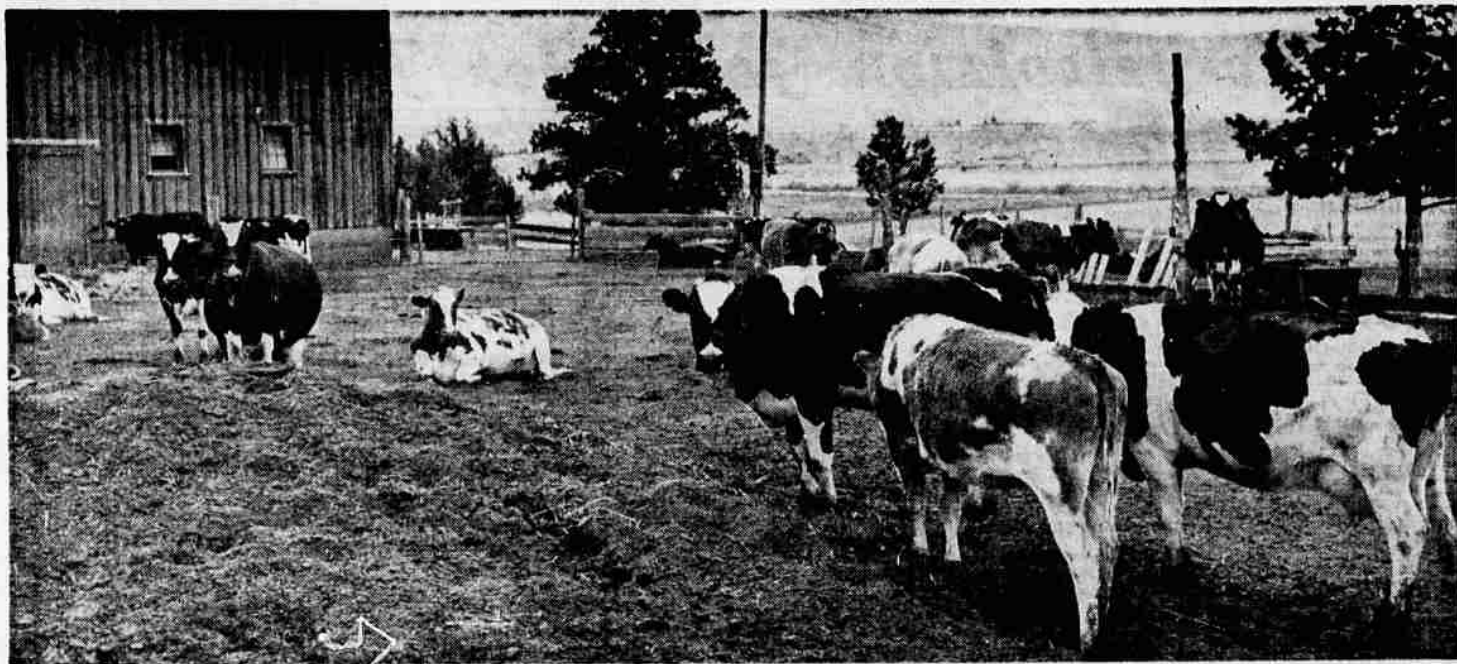




## FROM THE BASIN'S FINEST DAIRIES COMES FRESH RICH KLAMATH BASIN GRADE "A" MILK!

### THE ROMTVEDT DAIRY IN LANGELL VALLEY!

The fertile 160-acre farm of Mrs. Sondre Romtvedt and son Fred in Langell Valley is another of the typical Grade "A" Dairies that insures the Klamath Basin a plentiful supply of rich, wholesome Grade "A" Milk.

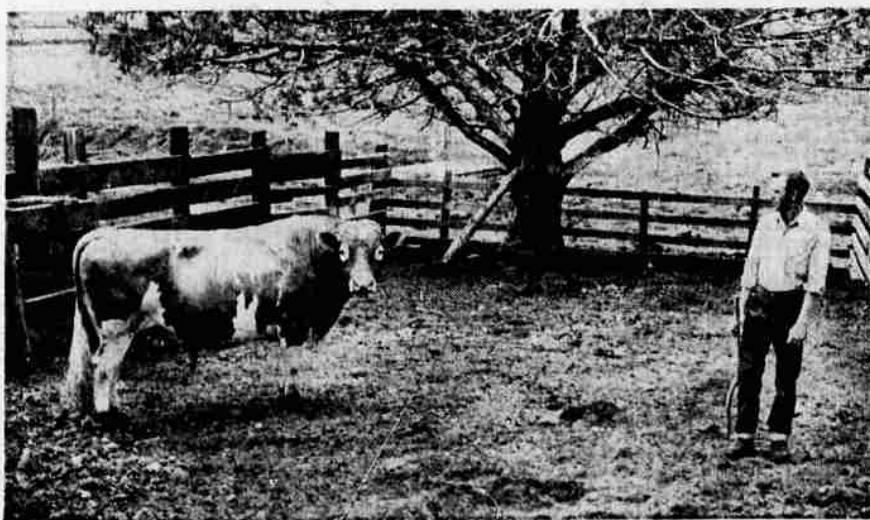
Milking a mixed herd of 80 Guernseys, Jerseys and Holsteins assures the Romtvedts of high milk production rich in butterfat.

The dairy was founded by the late Sondre Romtvedt 23 years ago. The big 50x150-ft. barn in the background above is a former drying shed from the old Ewauna Box Factory which used to stand just west of the South 6th Street Overpass. Sondre Romtvedt, a carpenter before turning dairyman, purchased the building, dismantled it, and moved it to the dairy after Ewauna sold out.

Fred Romtvedt says that with such a gigantic barn, there is never any worry about shelter for the cattle or storage for the tons of feed needed for the herd.
