Bacteria-Killer In Blood Offers MDs New Weapon

NEW YORK (UPI)—A bacteria-killer which maintains itself much longer in the human blood stream than any other promises to give medical science a powerful new weapon against bacteria-caused illnesses.

Its remarkable staying power in the blood stream has just been proved in a Harvard Medical School laboratory by Drs. Calvin M. Kimm and Maxwell Finland. For maximum curative effect you want to maintain a bacteria-killer in the blood stream in the smallest effective dose for as long as possible. Otherwise you knock off too many of the good bacteria the body needs.

The remaining question about the new bacteria-killer is whether it kills enough kinds of sickness-causing bacteria to make it a more useful weapon than the killers now in general use.

You can assume it does because it is a close relative of the "broad-spectrum" antibiotics, the tetracyclines, which are two-edged swords because they kill the good and bad bacteria with equal zeal.

The new antibiotic stems from a reproductive quirk in the fungus which, merely by living, produces broad-spectrum bacteria killers. The quirk was in its hereditary gene. They changed or mutated and the result was a chemically changed fungus which makes the new killer. Its chemical name is almost as long as your arm. For short, it is called dact.

Kunin and Finland tested its

staying powers in the blood stream in this way: They dosed eight young men with the new killer and the best of the old killers (from the viewpoint of staying power). The antibiotics were given in pill form and the doses of the new and the old were always the same.

Blood was drawn from the young men at various intervals after they had taken the pills and the ability of these blood samples to kill three varieties of bacteria was most scientifically measured by test-tube techniques.

"The superiority of the activity of dact is all the more impressive because the study on repeated doses was carried out under normal dietary conditions and was otherwise carefully controlled for comparability of the conditions, and the differences were uniform, striking and statistically highly significant," the scientists reported.

What this means is that the new antibiotic may be given in smaller and less frequent doses to get the same bacteria-killing effect as the older antibiotics. That would make it much less of a two-edged sword; it could remove the harmful edge altogether.

But there must be further study, the scientists said in reporting to the New England Journal of Medicine. They want to know especially if it kills as many kinds of sickening bacteria as its parents, the tetracyclines. Direct comes from the Lederle Laboratories, Pearl River, N. Y., which had much to do with developing spectrum antibiotics.

Coroner's Jury Selected To Probe School Holocaust

CHICAGO (AP)—Chicago's angry probe into the how and why of the parochial school fire which took 91 lives a week ago moves ahead today with the naming of a blue ribbon coroner's jury.

Coroner Walter E. McCarron, who will select the 18-man jury for the inquest beginning Wednesday, promised that "everything will be brought out."

The coroner said the jury will be composed of experts in fire prevention, building construction and education.

McCarron said he hopes to have available the fire and building inspection records of the Our Lady of the Angels grade school where 88 children and three nuns were killed or fatally injured.

Eleven survivors still are in the critical list. They are among 38 persons still in seven hospitals. Among those witnesses already

summoned to the inquest, McCarron said, are pupils of the school, the janitor of the brick structure, and members of the police arson squad.

Officers of the arson squad still were questioning some of the 1,200 students who escaped the fire and residents of the North-west Side neighborhood to learn the cause of the blaze.

At least one investigator so far leans to the theory the fire sprang up in a wooden staircase of the two-story building after smoldering for more than an hour in a pile of trash.

Whether such a fire was started accidentally—as by a discarded match or cigarette—or by an arsonist still was guesswork.

John J. Ahern, director of fire protection and safety engineering at Illinois Institute of Technology, said the fire was the "old story" of unprotected stairwells. In a television interview, Ahern said smoke and heat rushed up open stairwells blocking exits and fire escapes. An ideal solution, he said, would be to construct one-story schools with an outside door for each classroom.

Special collections to aid families of the dead and injured were made in churches throughout the city. The fund already exceeds \$126,000.

Jury Resumes Bomb Hearing

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP)—A Fulton Superior Court jury today resumed deliberating the case of George Bright, first of five persons to be tried on charges of bombing an Atlanta Jewish Temple.

Court reconvenes after a Saturday midnight recess. The case went to the jury about 11 p.m. Saturday and when no verdict was reached by midnight, jurors taken to a hotel. Georgia law prohibits deliberations or verdicts on Sunday.

Jurors remained at the hotel the entire interval, declining Bright's offer of a bus ride for the group.

The five Atlanta area men were indicted on charges of dynamiting the Temple in Atlanta Oct. 12. The others, slated for trial later, are Wallace H. Allen, Kenneth Chester Griffin, Robert Bowling and Richard Bowling.

Pye told the jury it could return a verdict of guilty, in which case the sentence would be death, or recommend mercy, which would mean a life term, or acquit the 31-year-old engineer.

Bright has steadfastly maintained innocence, claiming he is a "peace-loving man, not a destroyer."

State Prosecutor Paul Webb told the jury that there was a common design by the defendants to create a disturbance and there was a definite conspiracy to bomb the Temple.
