Fire Marshal Hits School

ASHLAND (AP)—The state of Oregon Tuesday condemned the top floor of a school here as a fire hazard.

Classes immediately were dismissed for the remainder of the week.

Deputy Fire Marshal W. P. Roble ordered the condemnation at the Ashland Junior High School which has 340 pupils.

Local authorities asked the inspection in the wake of a Chicago school fire that last week killed 92 persons.

School officials said the school's two lower floors still could be used for classes. They said that when classes resume there probably will be double shifts.

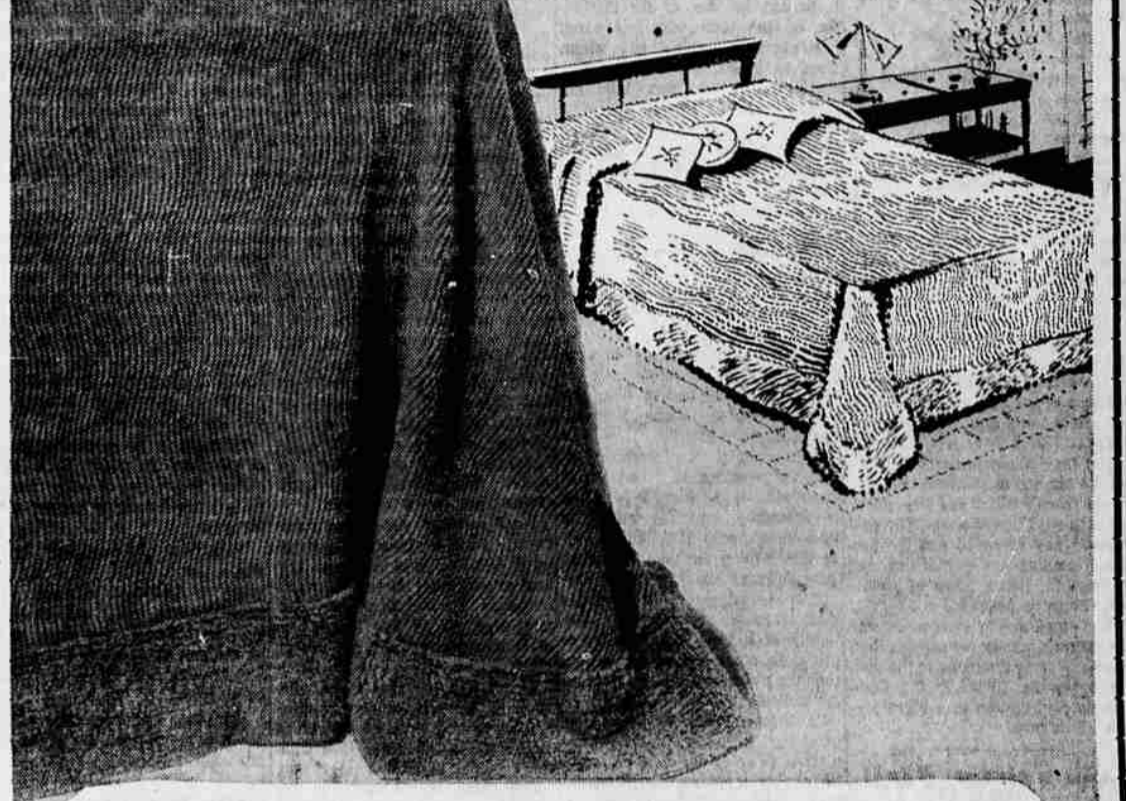
