Figures Told On SA Aid

During the month of November, the Salvation Army processed 373 applications for aid, involving 450 individuals, an increase of approximately 40 per cent over the previous month.

A large number of repeat applicants was noted. Thirty applicants were refused aid for various reasons including refusal to work for the meal sought and because they were "professional transients."

Services rendered totaling \$409.16 according to Capt. M. L. Kendall, included a request from one family for replacement of a radiator damaged by hitting a deer to counseling clients. The Salvation Army head also made 11 home calls during November in addition to 32 hours of counseling. He receives many calls for warm clothing and bedding for men traveling both north and south and for those working here who have not yet received pay checks. Lack of funds prevents many requests from being granted.

Families needing clothing are referred to the Salvation Army by the County Welfare office. There is a desperate need for children's clothing.

Capt. Kendall reported that 335 meals have been served, lodging provided for 78, clothing to 396 persons, shoes to 21, furniture for three, transportation has been arranged for two, a cash grant given to one person, grocery orders to five.

Fifteen persons were found employment, five telephone calls and telegrams were sent and four persons were referred to the White Shield Home.

Turkey Dinner Ends Contest

A turkey dinner climaxed a several-weeks contest between two adult Sunday School classes of Immanuel Baptist Church which ended recently.

The class taught by the Rev. Charles Myers was host to the losers, captained by Leo Zell. Margin between attendance in the two classes was only four per cent.

Mrs. Dee Phillips furnished the turkey.

Guest speaker was Dr. John Speering, Los Angeles. Sixty persons were present.

Plans for a new contest are being discussed by church leaders. The Rev. Myers extends an invitation to all those desiring a church home to attend services on Sunday, starting at 9:45 a.m.

Adventists To Fete Day

Investment Day will be observed in the Seventh-day Adventist Church, December 13, Dr. Craig Pearson is chairman.

At this time members will take proceeds of special projects started last spring to raise funds. In addition to the older groups, the kindergarten class has accumulated \$34 to turn in. This class is taught by Mrs. Cecil Humphrey.

Goal for the church is \$400. The church will open its 55th annual world mission appeal, December 17, soliciting house to house, accompanied by Christmas carolers. The campaign will be directed by the pastor, Elder Ronald Kegley. Most of the money collected will pay for world wide service last year.

On a world basis, volunteer Adventist workers in 1957 gave 5,868 hours in welfare services to 6,029,403 persons. More than one million dollars in cash, five million articles of clothing and 2,356 food baskets were contributed in a relief program conservatively valued at \$24,562,401. Approximately 50 per cent of this aid was given by North America.

Seventh-day Adventist members contributed more than 72 million dollars last year toward support of the world church program in addition to welfare activities.
