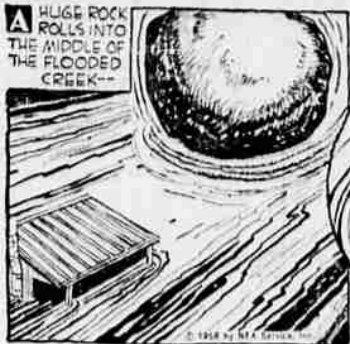

Youth Groups Pledge Fight

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Leaders of 24 teen-age clubs were pledged today to "do something" to end gang fights, drinking and vandalism.

This pledge was the result of a meeting sponsored by Carl V. May, executive secretary of Youths for Service, who has been working with club leaders for several weeks.

Among those attending the meeting Tuesday night were representatives from such rugged gangs as the Warlords, Los Bandidos, Esquires, Aces, Sheiks, Turbans, Ambassadors, Frisco Apaches, San Francisco Gents, the Barts and the Road Hunters.

They chose Percy Pinkney, 17, as president of an executive committee.

"We're going to try to get to all the clubs and try to stop all this vandalism, gang fighting and stealing," Pinkney said.

"We want to apply for job opportunities — get a garage and maybe a drag race strip."

"A lot of guys stay out late, drink and fool around. They really want something to work for. That's what we want to give them."

May estimated the 24 clubs at Tuesday's night's meeting represent half the teen-age clubs in the city.

"These fellows have taken on a terrific responsibility," he said. "They've really talked it up, both with their clubs and others."

Probers Still Perplexed Over LA Banker's Motives

LOS ANGELES (AP) — What made banker John Petersen become the Santa Claus of Sun Valley?

Investigators probing the tangled records of the Sun Valley National Bank haven't found the answer.

Fourteen persons got nearly a million dollars from the suburban bank with worthless checks because of Petersen's "good guy" approach to banking, a prosecutor said Tuesday.

"Petersen hasn't told us his whole story yet," U.S. Atty. Laughlin E. Waters said. "The incredible thing is why he did it."

One depositor is accused of having cashed checks totaling \$296,067 on an account containing \$131. Another assertedly cashed more than \$129,000 with 301 checks on an account overdrawn \$43,500.

Petersen, 49, a mild-mannered former vice president and cashier at the bank, assertedly paid off the worthless checks and then hid

Youths Banned From Racing

SALEM (AP)—Children under 16 years old can't operate their quarter-midget racers on public streets, state Motor Vehicles Director James F. Johnson warned Thursday.

"These little cars, he said, are motor vehicles under the law. Therefore, he added, nobody can operate one of them on a street or highway unless he is a licensed driver."

When these cars are operated on streets or highways, they must have regular automobile license plates.

He said the Portland Juvenile Court has had six cases involving operation of these cars on streets in the past two weeks. The drivers were 12 or 13 years old.

Video Grant Set Aside

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Federal Communications Commission Thursday set aside a grant for a new television translator station at Roseburg, Ore.

The FCC said it set aside the grant because the original application of the Teleservice Co. was faulty.

If the firm corrects the faults, the commission said it would consider the application again.

The firm had proposed to operate its station on Channel 83, and reproduce programs of KOIN-TV in Portland.

The FCC re-examined its Oct. 1 grant after a protest was lodged by KPIC-TV, a station which operates on Channel 4 in Roseburg. KPIC-TV said the translator station would injure it economically.
