Registrars Quit Before Probe Opens

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (AP) — The U.S. Civil Rights Commission plans to resume its hearing into Negro voting here next Friday, but there are indications there will be fewer voter registrars to question.

Three already have resigned and there were reports that more would leave rather than allow registration of Negro voters.

There also was speculation there will not be many records for the commission's subcommittee, which will hold the second hearing, to see. Under Alabama law records of unsuccessful applicants do not have to be preserved by the registrars.

Commission Chairman John A. Hannah said he and former Gov. Doyle E. Carlton of Florida would make up the subcommittee.

In San Angelo, Tex., Sen. Lyndon Johnson (D-Tex) expressed the belief that "without question, the commission has the authority" to subpoena voter records in Alabama. Speaking to students at San Angelo College, the Senate majority leader also said he thinks "everyone ought to have the right to vote, whether he's white or brown or black."

The registrars resigning were E. P. Livingston and Grady Rogers of Macon County and R. E. Cook of Wilcox. Macon County, which has a heavy Negro population, was left without a voter registration board since the third member had died about a month ago.

Livingston and Rogers were among the five registrars who refused to testify before the commission earlier last week regarding Negro voter registration and who were named Thursday in a U.S. District Court order.

Jury May Advise Safety Systems

CHICAGO (AP) — A coroner's jury probing the parochial grade school fire is certain to recommend that sprinkler systems be made mandatory in Chicago schools, the foreman of the investigative body believes.

Roy Tuebrenner, an insurance executive and foreman of the jury of 16 experts, said Friday that testimony taken in the initial three days of hearings has failed to provide even a hint of how the fire started.

The cause may never be known, he said, unless more information is provided.

The flash fire at Our Lady of the Angels School brought death to 89 pupils and three nuns. The jury, called by Cook County (Chicago) Coroner Walter McCarron, is seeking the cause of the fire. The inquest was continued to Monday.

U.S. Ends Principal Phase In Surplus Plants Case

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government concluded Thursday the principal phase of its defense against a court of claims suit by Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Corp. for an adjustment of the price it paid for three war surplus aluminum plants.

Kaiser is seeking about 5 1/2 million dollars on grounds the government did not keep its promise not to give a better deal to any of its competitors.

Kaiser contends that Reynolds Metals Co. got more for its money in buying four surplus plants in December, 1949, than Kaiser got in a deal concluded in July of that same year.

Kaiser presented its case to Commissioner William Day in trial sessions in Washington and San Francisco in October.

The government's final witness here Thursday was John Alico, New York consulting engineer employed by the Justice Department to inspect all seven plants.

Alico testified that, in general, the four plants purchased by Reynolds for 50 million dollars had higher operating costs than the three plants bought by Kaiser for 36 million dollars.

Sales to both companies were based on 39.39 per cent of the government's original acquisition cost. The plants purchased by Kaiser were a Baton Rouge, La., alumina plant, the Mead, Wash., reduction plant and the Trentwood, Wash., rolling mill. The plants bought by Reynolds were the Hurricane Creek, Ark., alumina plant, the Jones Mill, Ark., and Troutdale, Ore., reduction plants, and the McCook, Ill., rolling mill.

The trial was recessed until Dec. 18 to hear two more government witnesses.

Carling Acquires Tacoma Brewery

TACOMA (AP) — Sale of Heidelberg Brewing Co.'s physical assets here to Carling Brewing Co. for an estimated 3 1/2 million dollars was approved by Heidelberg stockholders Friday.

Norman Davis, Heidelberg president, said sale of the Tacoma firm's assets will be completed by Dec. 31. The company's stockholders will receive an initial payment of \$4 a share within 60 days of closing and another 90c to \$1.10 a share within a year, he said.

Carling plans to retain all Heidelberg employees and to continue the Heidelberg brand, Davis said.
