**U.S. Policy Told By Army Leader**

FORT LEWIS, Wash. (AP)—In discussing the Berlin situation, Secretary of the Army Wilbur Brucker said Saturday the United States is not "going back away from a fight."

"The fellow that does is the kind that gets clobbered," he told more than 1,000 persons gathered in the post theater here. "We have made our policy clear—we will stay in Berlin."

Brucker, who stopped here on his way to Alaska for a visit to defense installations, said the show of force in Lebanon and the Formosa Strait made the Communists back down. And, he said, it won great respect for U.S. soldiers throughout the world.
