Liberal Solons Call Huddle

WASHINGTON (AP) — Leaders of a group of self-styled House liberals called a strategy huddle today in their drive to cut down the House Rules Committee's control of legislation.

The liberal group comprises 90 present House members and about 40 members-elect from the North and West. Their goal is to win a stronger voice in House leadership councils and to break the legislative stranglehold of Republicans and Southern Democrats on the powerful Rules Committee.

Rep. Frank Thompson (D-N.J.) said the liberals hope today's meeting will produce "as broad a consensus as possible which can form the basis for discussion with the leadership."

Major change sought by the liberal group is restoration of the 21-day rule which limits the power of the Rules Committee to block legislation recommended by other committees.

There now is virtually no limit on the length of time the Rules Committee can bottle up bills.

The 21-day rule, adopted in 1949 and repealed two years later, permitted other committees to obtain a House vote on their bills if the Rules Committee refused to clear those bills within 21 days after a formal request.

Toilers Build New Flagpole

WASHINGTON (AP) — Old Glory will be shifted soon from one of two special positions atop the Capitol—but it will wave on without interruption, day and night.

Workmen remodeling the east front of the building have erected a new flagpole jutting from the base of the dome just above the pole that has to come down. The shift may come this week.

Once the east front extension is done, probably in September 1960, the flag will go back to its time-honored place on the east portico.

Two flags—one on the east side and one on the west side—fly night and day over the Capitol. It is the only instance where Congress has decreed an exception to the regulation that the U.S. flag must come down at sundown.

'Defrosted' Defiant Widow Has Reunion With Tar Son

NORTON, Va. (AP) — A "defrosted" but still defiant widow enjoyed a reunion with her sailor son today after ending a six-day sitdown protest against the sale of her home by public auction.

Mrs. Ella Williams, 56, said she had headed a friendly warning her 20-year-old son Lowell had telephoned Saturday from Great Lakes Naval Training Station in Illinois.

"Mom, I'm leaving now to fly home. When I get there I'd better not catch you outside," his son told her.

He didn't. Several hours before he arrived, Mrs. Williams had accepted shelter in the home of Roda and Octavia Sidham, spinster sisters and lifelong friends of Mrs. Williams.

But the sisters had to talk, plead and cry before the stubborn widow would leave her snow-swept post outside the family home, which the county had sold to pay off debts.

The tent where Mrs. Williams had remained for six days was covered with four inches of snow. Her possessions were scattered about the yard under the snow.

In her last hours outdoors, Mrs. Williams had been reported "weak and pale." A doctor said she could not live through many more bitter cold nights.

Fire Fumes Kill Couple

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. (AP) — "Grandma, we can't wake up Ma-ma or Daddy," the child's voice piped over the telephone when Mrs. Orie Aadema called her daughter Sunday.

Mrs. Aadema called the sheriff's office. Officers found Stuart Fause, 45, and his wife Virginia, 40, dead in their home. They had been overcome by fumes from a fire in a bedroom fireplace which had smothered out as they slept.

The officers were met by the couple's daughters, Paula, 5, and Jan, 4. The girls said they had been asleep in another room. They said that they had tried to wake their parents but were unable to do so.

Officers said the girls were not overcome because the fumes were confined to the parents' room and had dissipated by the time the children entered.

Paula and Jan were placed temporarily in their grandmother's care.

Youth Gang Keeps Pledge

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP) — The King Cobras, who reformed publicly 10 months ago, have made it stick.

They're the juvenile gang members who gave a "restitution dinner" last February after some of them took part in a grocery burglary.

The dinner netted \$133.08 to more than repay the grocer. A judge gave them another chance.

"What's happened since?" "They're making good," said James L. White, executive director of Neighborhood House, Inc., the social service agency that helped them with the public re-payment dinner.

"Not one boy has been in trouble with the law since."

The King Cobras gang has been dissolved and the youths have gone separate ways.

The answer, says White, was "redirection."

"Everyone has weaknesses—but he has strengths too. What we have done is built on their strengths."

Two of the boys organized a dance band. Several others made athletic teams at their schools. Another has been elected to his school's student council.

White has lost track of two of the former Cobra gang members whose families moved to the East.

One of the former Cobra leaders will be graduated from high school in June and plans to study engineering.

"I know I'm not going to have any more trouble," he said. "I just wish I could erase my record. It was pretty stupid."
