ON THE ROCKS

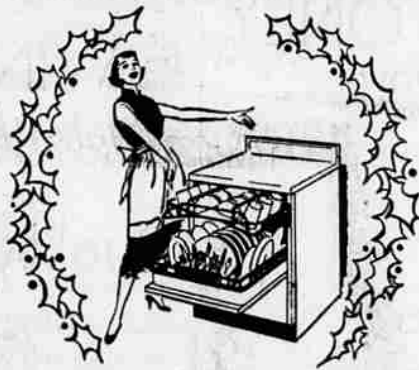
PHILADELPHIA (UPI)—There was plenty of free whisky on the rocks here Wednesday.
