Quick Thinking Saves KF Man

When the baby's high chair slipped out from under William Moore, who had climbed on it to repair a kitchen light fixture, the consequences were dramatic. On his way to the floor, Moore slammed against a window which broke under the impact, and the shattered glass severed an artery and tendons in his right arm. The accident occurred at about 8 p.m. Thursday.

While Moore's wife summoned Peace Ambulance to their residence at 1650 Arthur Street, Moore managed to get hold of a baby's diaper, with which he improvised a tourniquet to stanch the flow of blood. Thanks to this self-held under trying circumstances, as well as to the prompt appearance of the ambulance, the 34-year-old Moore survived what could have been a fatal injury.

In fact, he survived so well that he was able to return home from the hospital Friday morning.

BOISE, Idaho (AP)—The federal government Thursday transferred to California its first case under a new obscene literature statute after the defendants indicated they would plead guilty.

Actress Seeking Estate Money

HOLLYWOOD, Calif. (AP)—Linda Christian wants \$650 a month from Tyrone Power's estate for support of each of their two daughters.

Her attorney James Fizzolio said he will ask Superior Court to authorize the payment because when Power and Miss Christian were divorced no provision was made for child support.

"With Power's death, alimony to Miss Christian ceased," he said. "For this reason, support for the children must come from the estate."

U.S. Atty. Ben Peterson filed the case in U.S. District Court here last week against Charles G. and Mary J. Hall of Cottonwood, Calif. The charge accuses the couple of sending from California and Medford, Ore., information on how to obtain obscene matter and obscene pictures. The couple was accused of sending the materials received. Previous procedure required charges to be brought in the district from which the mail originated.

Officials said the two defendants have signed statements indicating that they wish to plead guilty. The statements also consented to prosecution by information rather than indictment.

Five counts were specified. Maximum penalty for conviction under the law is a \$5,000 fine, five years in prison, or both.

The only train the rush has held up for any considerable time thus far was the southbound mail on Wednesday, which arrived in Klamath Falls at 3:20 p.m., instead of the scheduled hour of 7:30 a.m.
